

Forming Children and Youth for the Mass, Part 2: Song and Praise

This is the second article in a series about forming children for active participation in the Mass.

Children and youth can be encouraged to participate in the Mass by helping them become comfortable with singing and sung prayer and praise.

Certainly, children should be taught to sing songs the parish community uses at Mass, whether their community's musical style is traditional or contemporary. Every child should open the hymnal and sing.

By all means use good CDs and music videos. Catholic ones can be purchased from most major hymnal publishers, who often have great recorded music, some of which is intended for youth. When using recorded music, be sure to provide the children with the words so they can learn them and sing along.

What does all of this do? Musical training conditions children and youth to make a joyful noise to God. It helps them understand that singing to God is natural and enjoyable, and it shows them that God is worthy of praise. It helps children understand why at Mass we say, "It is right and just," to praise God. It helps them overcome the fear of singing in public by showing them that even if they think they "can't sing," God wants to hear their voices thanking God for His blessings.

Family Night: Kids will love diversion from digital isolation Ed Langlois of the Catholic Sentinel

In some households family night means everyone going to his or her room alone with an iPad or other electronic device. Family nights can enhance relationships and can be just plain fun. Kids, even if it's not evident, love to do things with their parents.

Family Night Ideas:

Music Share – As you wash dishes, or clean a room together, family members take turns playing songs from an iPod or stereo for everyone.

Extra, Extra! – Create a family newsletter to send to relatives and friends.

Star Watching – Lay out a blanket on the lawn and look at the stars.

Bake Time - Bake cookies together.

Obstacle Course – Using things like hula hoops and jump ropes, create a backyard obstacle course in which you can compete with each other for best time.

Family Game Show – Set up a simple stage and have family members act as host, contestant and audience. Use trivia questions or word games.

Sock Golf – Roll up a sock for each player. Take turns naming a spot in the house where the players must hit the sock with their hands – onto the easy chair, onto the fourth step, into the waste basket.

Spiritual Direction: For Saints and Sinners By Lianna Mueller (Ignitum Today)

Can you recall any saints that ascended to holiness all on their own? It's hard to think of saints as solo travelers. We usually think of St. Francis and St. Clare as a pair and St. Monica and St. Augustine were mother and son. This October, Bl. Louis and Zelie Martin, the parents of St. Therese of Lisieux will also be canonized. Countless saints were married to another holy person or in religious communities that enabled them to have a strong Christian community. We need companions on this journey that is often unclear. Spiritual direction can be very beneficial as we continue in our relationship with God.

A spiritual director isn't someone who can give you answers. He or she will ask questions to help you determine how God is speaking to you and to help you determine how you are listening. His or her role is to assist you in determining the answers that God may be giving you through different means and can assist you in seeing events in your life or your thoughts from a different perspective. As you bring up your challenges in making an important decision, say, about a career change, your spiritual director can help you figure out how to proceed in your discernment.

Sometimes spiritual direction will be a necessary reality check—and not a pretty one. Thankfully, a good spiritual director will keep you accountable to your prayer life. That is where everything comes back to — your time with the Lord. A good spiritual director will gently but firmly remind you of the path you need to follow. Other times spiritual direction will help you find clarity that you are on the right road, even though the path may be dark.

In the past, you may have tried to speak with a person you admired for his or her wisdom—and found the experience lacking. Even though a person may be very holy, personalities don't always line up. Sometimes you might meet with multiple people before you find someone well-suited to you. That's ok! In order for the experience to nurture your walk with God, it is imperative to find someone who understands your perspective and with whom you feel comfortable.

Don't be intimidated by the prospect of spiritual direction. I have found it to be positive and insightful, especially with a well-chosen spiritual director. Spiritual direction is for *everyone*. Whether you are new to the Christian life or a monk who has lived in a monastery for thirty years, you can benefit from talking with someone wiser and learned in the things of God. If you are seeking to deepen your relationship with God or wondering where to go at the fork in the road, I encourage you to look into this avenue. A spiritual director well-suited to you will help you to stay on the right road and to navigate the sometimes murky and choppy waters of the spiritual life. 
