



Elementary

Forming Children and Youth for the Mass, Part 3: Listening to the Word

This is the third article in a series about forming children for active participation in the Mass.

To help children listen well to the Word of God at Mass, provide experiences of Scripture that allow young people to respect the Word, to become aware that Jesus speaks to them through it, and to engage in holy listening.*

Respect for the Word

From early childhood, children should learn that a reading from the Bible is something special and that they should listen with respect. Parents can emphasize rituals such as <u>enthroning the Bible</u> or Bible storybook, handling it reverently, and using gestures and words we say at Mass: "A reading from the Book/ Gospel of..." and, "The Word/Gospel of the Lord." There should be silence before and after the reading.

When teaching children about the parish church, the sacredness of the ambo as the place for the reading of the Word should be emphasized, so that children know when the reader approaches it, it is time to listen in a special way. Likewise, when teaching about the structure of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Word should be treated as a special time to listen.

Jesus Speaks Through Scripture

By using guided meditation and prayer with Scripture, parents can engage children's minds and imaginations to hear Jesus. Prayerful listening requires children's full attention and trains them to encounter Jesus and hear him speak to them directly through the Bible stories.

A non-scriptural resource to begin an imaginative journey to Jesus with the very young is <u>The Ball of Red String</u>. A sample guided reflection, "Called to Holiness," can be found at *Catechist's Journey*. With older children, you can also use the <u>3-Minute Retreats</u> to encourage praying with Scripture.

Holy Listening

The Introduction to the Lectionary for Mass says, "When God communicates his word, he expects a response, one that is, of listening and adoring 'in Spirit and in truth' (John 4:23). The Holy Spirit makes that response effective, so that what is heard in the celebration of the Liturgy may be carried out in a way of life..." (6) The participation of the people, it says, increases according to how deeply they listen and try to live the Word. Lectio Divina, an ancient four-step process of praying with Scripture, can help children practice hearing what God is saying to them through Scripture. Some add a fifth step, action, and that can help children make a decision to live what they have heard. Parents can have older children write in a journal after Lectio Divina.

If these strategies are a regular part of faith formation, children will be much more likely to listen and better equipped for their role as hearers of the Word at Mass.

6 Ways to Pass on the Catholic Faith to Your Children

How do we pass on the Catholic faith to our kids? This is what we all want, right? Keep them Catholic? To raise little saints? But the really big question is how do we accomplish that?

Teach them the basics. Your kids need to have an understanding of the basics from a young age. Basics include: the Trinity, the True Presence in the Eucharist, why we have Saints, what the Mass is all about, and the amazing blessing the Bible is to all Christians!

Saturate the home. Fill your home with prayers, love, Christian virtues, and yes, even statues, pictures, medals, and other reminders of our religious heroes. These things can't just exist at church; they need to be in the home.

Make religion relatable and engaging for children. Meet them at their own level! For me, I have used a lot of crafts, activities, and songs to reach my children with the word of God at their own level. Now that my kids are getting a bit older, we're having more discussions, starting prayer journals, and reading more books.

Make sure they really get a good Catholic education. This education can't come from one hour of Religious Education per week! It's not enough. It has to come from you, the parent.

Weave the faith into your Life. Do not let the faith be like a puzzle piece in your life that could be plucked out and tossed aside. The faith should be so interwoven into your life that if you tried to remove it, you wouldn't even know where to start, and if you succeeded in removing it, the whole masterpiece would be destroyed.

Lead by example. The whole do-what-I-say-and-not-what-I-do thing is not gonna cut it.

All we can do is our best. After all, God gave all of us free will, and our children will have to choose God for themselves freely. If you wanted to say that Adam and Eve had "parents", it would be God. God was the perfect parent to them, providing everything they needed, loving them, and nurturing them flawlessly. Yet, Adam and Eve still messed up, didn't they? While keeping that in mind, we still want to do the best that we can.
