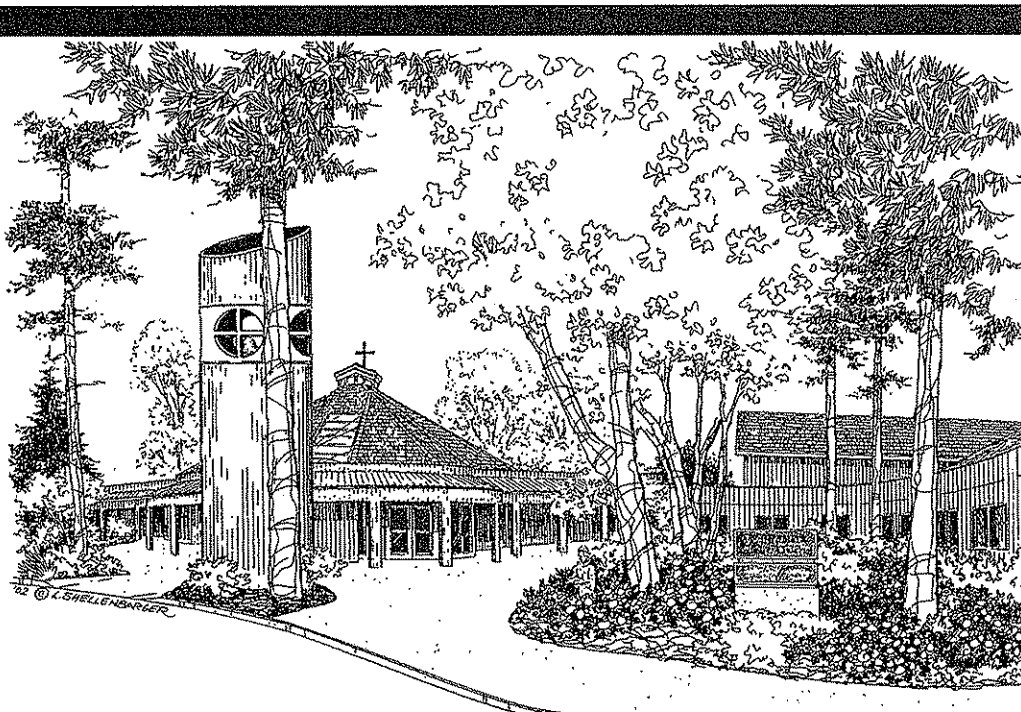
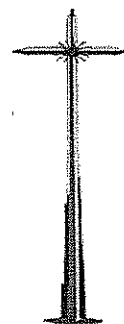

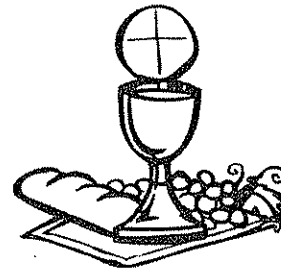

**Forming Children and Youth for the Mass, Part 4: Intercessory Prayer** Joyce Donahue; Catechists Journey, Loyola Press

*This is the fourth article in a series about forming children for active participation in the Mass.*

In the Universal Prayer or Prayer of the Faithful at Mass (formerly called the General Intercessions), the people claim their baptismal priesthood "by offering prayers for the salvation of all." (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 69)

## Elementary, cont.

How can we help children and youth growing up in a culture that focuses on "me first" to understand and join in those prayers with their whole hearts?

### **Intercessory Prayer with Younger Children**

Catechists can help children become comfortable with praying for the needs of others out loud by simply asking, "Who needs our prayers today?" Even the youngest children can understand that. Usually, they will respond readily with requests for sick or sad family members (and often for family pets). Children can also be encouraged to pray for one another in their classroom community of faith. Use the formula we most often use in church: "For \_\_\_\_\_, we pray to the Lord" and teach them to respond with "Lord, hear our prayer." This can be included in every opening or closing prayer in faith formation sessions. Soon, children will be eager to offer their intentions.

Send home instructions for family prayer that includes the use of intercessions to remind parents of their role in teaching their children to pray in the context of the domestic church and encourage them to learn to pray for others. Couple this request with suggestions for ways to serve others, and suggest praying for those they serve.

### **Prayer of the Faithful with Youth**

Catechists and youth leaders can teach the connection between intercessory prayer and our baptismal duty to pray for others. It is not just the priest who prays at Mass but the people as well. Explain that the Mass is a special time to bring our concerns before God. We do this in three ways: Each person at Mass should have his/her own intention to remember at the beginning of Mass when the priest says, "Let us pray."

The community has a public intention for each Mass. The Prayer of the Faithful names additional intentions, based on the readings and on the needs of the community and world.

Show students that there is a normal order for these prayers, and use this order in session prayer. Allow youth to help write intentions for Masses in which they have a role. The official order is to pray for:

- the needs of the Church
- public authorities and the salvation of the whole world
- those burdened by any kind of difficulty
- the local community. (*GIRM*, 70)

This is also a great connection to studying the structure of the Church, its relation to the world, or social justice. Help students to understand who we pray for at Mass—and why. Doing all of this will help form a generation of young people mindful of the needs of our world, who see the connection between those needs and their participation in the prayers of the Mass.

## 6 Ways to Pass on the Catholic Faith to Your Children

How do we pass on the Catholic faith to our kids? This is what we all want, right? Keep them Catholic? To raise little saints? But the really big question is how do we accomplish that?

**Teach them the basics.** Your kids need to have an understanding of the basics from a young age. Basics include: the Trinity, the True Presence in the Eucharist, why we have Saints, what the Mass is all about, and the amazing blessing the Bible is to all Christians!

**Saturate the home.** Fill your home with prayers, love, Christian virtues, and yes, even statues, pictures, medals, and other reminders of our religious heroes. These things can't just exist at church; they need to be in the home.

**Make religion relatable and engaging** for children. Meet them at their own level! For me, I have used a lot of crafts, activities, and songs to reach my children with the word of God at their own level. Now that my kids are getting a bit older, we're having more discussions, starting prayer journals, and reading more books.

**Make sure they really get a good Catholic education.** This education can't come from one hour of Religious Education per week! It's not enough. It has to come from you, the parent.

**Weave the faith into your Life.** Do not let the faith be like a puzzle piece in your life that could be plucked out and tossed aside. The faith should be so interwoven into your life that if you tried to remove it, you wouldn't even know where to start, and if you succeeded in removing it, the whole masterpiece would be destroyed.

**Lead by example.** The whole do-what-I-say-and-not-what-I-do thing is not gonna cut it.

All we can do is our best. After all, God gave all of us free will, and our children will have to choose God for themselves freely. If you wanted to say that Adam and Eve had "parents", it would be God. God was the perfect parent to them, providing everything they needed, loving them, and nurturing them flawlessly. Yet, Adam and Eve still messed up, didn't they? While keeping that in mind, we still want to do the best that we can.

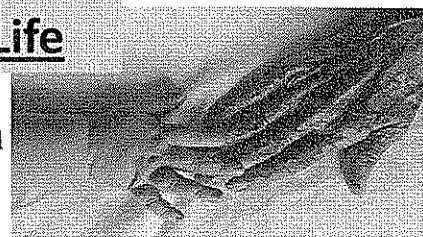
