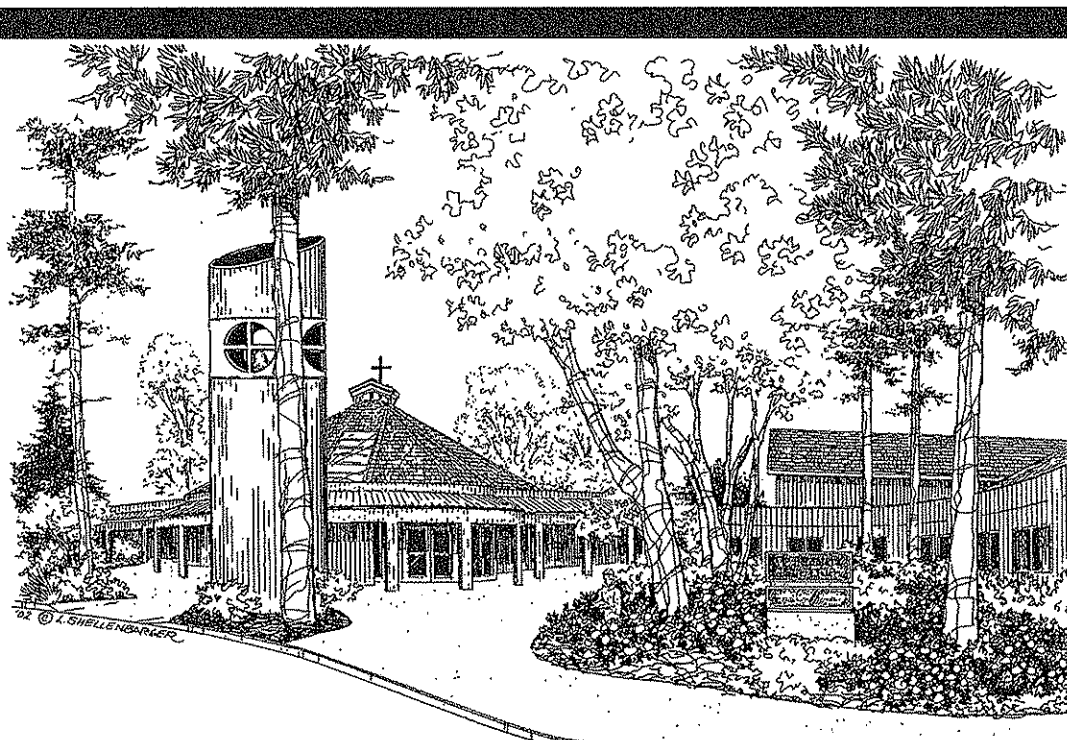

## Faith Formation

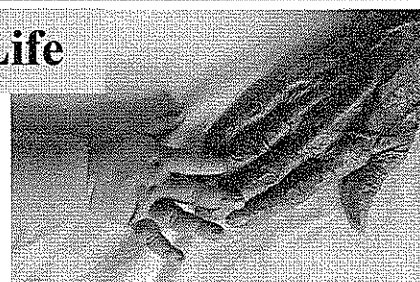

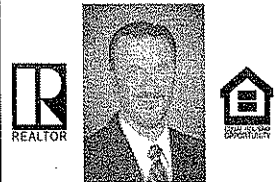
