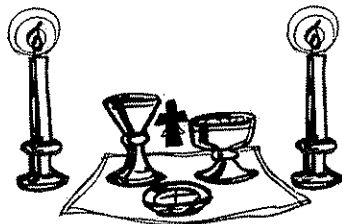

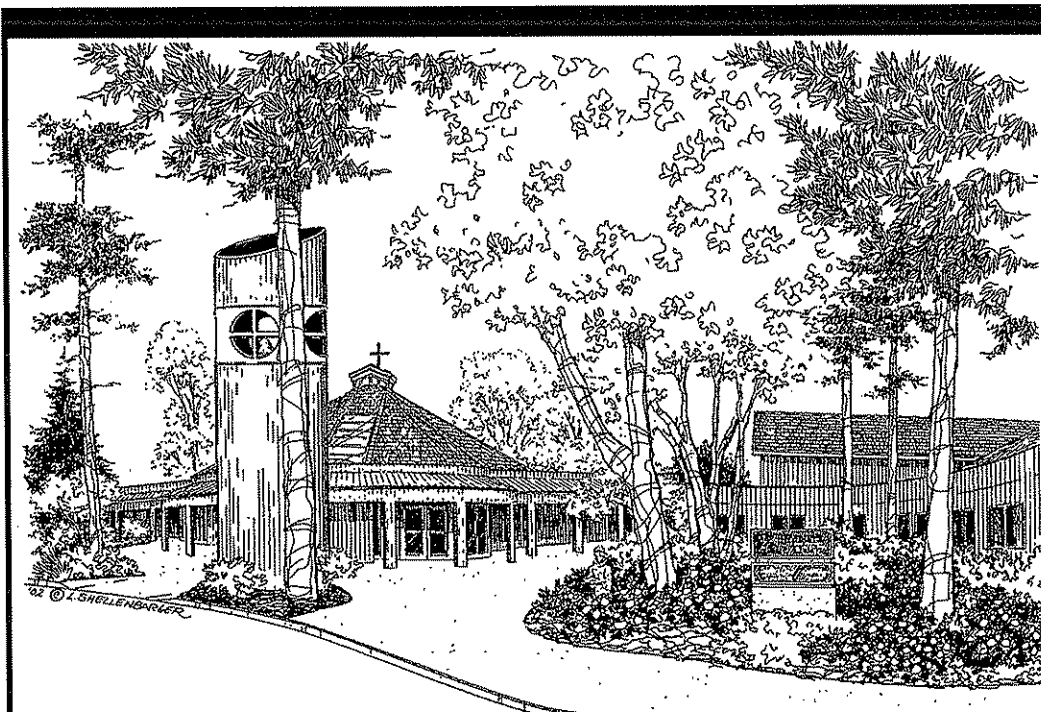

Holy Week, March 20 – 27

Palm Sunday – 5:30 pm Saturday evening, 8:00 am, 10:30 am and 5:00 pm Sunday
Palms will be handed out as you enter church. You will be invited to go outside church and be part of the procession into church. Palms are a sign of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. After 8:00 am and 10:30 am Masses, come to the parish center to learn how to creatively fold palms for use in your home.

Wednesday – Reconciliation, 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm and 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm

Holy Thursday Mass – 7:00 pm

This is the anniversary of the institution of the Eucharist and beginning of the Triduum. We will wash feet of 12 representative parishioners to remind us of Jesus' washing the feet of the 12 apostles. We will process to the parish center at the conclusion of the liturgy to repose the Blessed Sacrament and allow us a chance to adore the Blessed Sacrament until 10:00 pm.

Good Friday Stations of the Cross – 12:00 noon

Stations will be led both inside the church and outside along the Stations of the Cross pathway through the woods.

Good Friday Veneration of the Cross and Communion – 7:00 pm

This is an opportunity to venerate the Cross by either kissing the Cross or performing some act of reverence before the Cross. We then receive the Eucharist that was consecrated on Holy Thursday evening.

Easter Vigil Mass – 8:30 pm

We bless the new Easter candle and light it from a fire outside the church. We then listen to readings about Salvation history followed by welcoming new members into the Catholic faith.

Easter morning Mass – 8:00 am, 10:30 am and 12:30 pm.

NO 5:00 PM MASS

We celebrate Jesus rising from the dead. This is the culminating celebration of our Catholic faith.

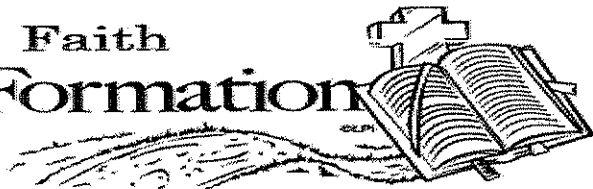

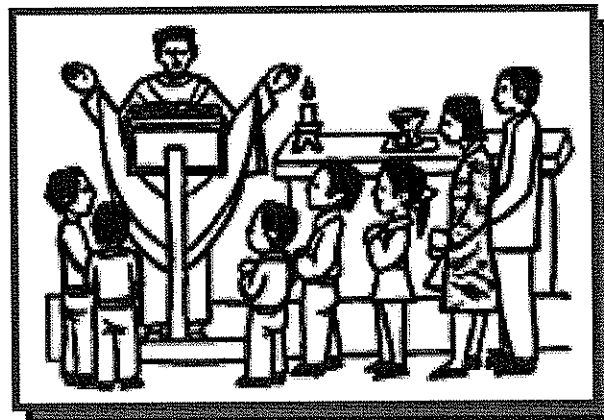
High School

4th Corporal Work of Mercy: "Harbor the Harborless"

This week we will focus on the next corporal works of mercy, "harbor the harborless" (shelter the homeless). The Vatican highlighted this particular work of mercy this year when the "Gift of Mercy" homeless shelter was established in October.

The Vatican's latest initiative was part of a much larger effort to serve the homeless men and women of Rome. Earlier this year Pope Francis established showers, bathrooms and a barbershop inside the Vatican.

Pope Francis is trying to lead by example and show the world that we need to care for the homeless and not debase or humiliate them. Often homeless people are avoided on the streets and are seen as an embarrassment to society.

The Christian response should not be one of scorn, but of encounter. In particular, we should keep these two Scripture passages in mind when serving the homeless:

"Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40).

"Do to others as you would have them do to you" (Luke 6:31)

We often forget that *we* could be the ones on the side of the street, begging for money and a place to stay.

I believe a large reason why we debase the homeless, is because we abide by the principle that we are the masters of our own destiny. We hold on high the "virtue" of individualism and can't understand why the homeless won't "get a job."

For example, it is cowardly to ask for help in our country, which becomes a double-edged sword. This means that the homeless are afraid of asking their friends and family for support and also that their friends and family are reluctant to offer any help. What results is a person who is afraid and alone in a society that doesn't care about them and tells them that they should be able to be successful without relying on anyone.

This is truly a shame and needs to be corrected. We need to view ourselves in a much larger context and not only seek our personal gain. The failures of the homeless in our community should matter to us and we should try to lift them up instead of tuck them away in a corner.

Let us not avoid those in our society who made mistakes and are suffering the consequences of them. Instead, let us encounter the lost and dejected and put ourselves in their shoes, realizing that we could easily be the ones who are in need of Christian charity.

Jubilee Year of Mercy

What is a Jubilee Year in the Catholic Church? A Jubilee Year is when the Catholic Church across the world takes a year to focus on forgiveness and healing in a special way. Catholics are encouraged to join together in prayer, go to confession, and share their commitment to Catholicism with others. The purpose of a Jubilee Year is to help people grow spiritually, strengthen their faith, encourage works of service, and to promote unity within the Catholic Church and society in general.

To celebrate the Jubilee Year of Mercy, St. Francis School is focusing on the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy. During Lent students in second through eighth grade celebrated the Spiritual Works of Mercy, Forgiving Injuries, through the sacrament of reconciliation. As a school we have chosen to work with Kairos Torch Ministry in California to practice the Corporal Works of Mercy, Visit the Prisoners. Students in kindergarten through fourth grade are creating a prayer chain to surround the youth with prayers during the Torch Weekend retreat while students in fifth through eighth grade are writing words of encouragements and prayers for the men.

The word *Kairos* means God's Special Time. The Torch is an introductory weekend program for people ages 24 and younger who live in juvenile detention or correctional facilities. The weekend is a combined effort of an ecumenical, Torch Team to introduce young men and women to Christian concepts as a means of making better choices for their lives.
