

From the desk of Father James

On this 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jesus is asking his disciples that are with Him a question. This same question can also be directed to us, "who do you say that I am?"

This is an important question for us to reflect upon. Who DO we say that Jesus is? We answer this question in many different ways each day of our life. I am sure that if we wrote down what the answer to this question is for us, while our answers may vary, would in many ways be very similar. But what if we compared that written answer with how we live our lives?

We answer the question about who Jesus is to us and who we say that He is to the world by how we live our lives. We encounter the familiar question, "if you were to be arrested and put on trial as a Christian, what would the evidence be that would be brought against you?" Is there enough to convict us of being a Christian? This evidence that could be used against us, is the very answer to the question of who Jesus is. Would there even be enough evidence to arrest us?

We answer the question of who Jesus is by our actions and how we live our lives. Are we compassionate, loving? Are we a voice for those that do not have a voice? Are we kind, just, merciful? Do we stay away from gossip? Do we include others? Do we put others needs before our own needs? Do we proclaim the good news? These are just a few examples of what we can reflect upon and what our actions in these and many other areas say about who Jesus is.

Who do you say that the Son of God is?

On another note, these past couple of weeks have been very busy for us here in the parish. We have celebrated two weddings, one on June 4 (Sterling and Amy Langrell), the second was this weekend (Tom and Jucell Rogers).
