

This week we come to the third Sunday of Advent and it is known as Gaudete Sunday. The name comes from the first words of the Entrance Antiphon which begins by reminding us to REJOICE.

Advent is certainly a time to rejoice. Yes, there is a certain penitential aspect that is present during this season. It is a time for us to stop everything that we are doing and to watch! Watch for whom? We are to watch for Jesus who promises to us that He will come again.

As we stop and refocus our lives once again on our beloved God, we may recognize that there are some areas in our lives in which we still need to grow. There may even be a few areas in which we need to take head of John the Baptist's advice for us to repent. We need to turn away from those things that keep us from being able to meet Christ and recognize Him as He comes to us in our daily lives.

I would encourage those of you that have not had the opportunity to take advantage of our God's mercy and forgiveness as we prepare to celebrate our Lord's birth to see about possibly attending one of the two final penance services in our vicariate. They are being offered, Tuesday, December 19 at 7:00 pm at Our Lady of the Lake and then on Wednesday, December 20 at 7:00 pm at St. Anthony.

At this time I also want to take a moment to thank everyone that has taken tags from our giving tree that is located in the outer narthex. Two weekends in a row the tree has been stripped bare of its tags. It is amazing to see the outpouring of love and Christmas cheer from all of you, particularly as you have responded so generously to bringing Christ's light and love to those in need. May God bless you for your generosity and compassion.

Classes will begin on Thursday, January 11 and continue until April 26







To have your donations count for the 2017 tax year, your contributions need to be postmarked no later than Saturday, December 30.

Christmas Day 2017 is on Monday, December 25 which follows the 4th Sunday of Advent, December 24. There have been some questions with regard to the obligations of this Holyday.

The Archdiocese has determined that each obligation must be met by attendance at one of the Masses of the Sunday and one of the Holyday. That is, a Christmas Mass on the evening of Sunday, December 24 (Vigil or Night) will not satisfy the obligation for the 4th Sunday of Advent.

There are two distinct obligations: that of the 4th Sunday of Advent which can be met by attendance at the vigil Mass on Saturday, December 23 or the morning Masses on Sunday, December 24; and that of Christmas which can be met by attendance at Masses on Christmas Eve (Vigil or Night) and on Christmas morning.

Save the date for the **Annual St Francis Crab Feed** on Saturday, January 13 at 6:30 pm. The cost is \$30 per person or \$50 per couple. Please contact the parish office by Monday, January 8 to RSVP.

Please be sure to check the website and Facebook for Mass cancellations due to poor weather conditions. St. Francis Church and School go by the Sherwood School District for closures and late starts. This applies to the parish office and Mass as well as the school.


