

"Do you love me?"


Here is the Lord, again appearing to the disciples after the Resurrection, and questioning the Apostle Peter; and he obliges him three times to confess his love, because three times he had denied him through fear. Christ rose again in the flesh, and Peter in the spirit; because when Christ died in his Passion, Peter died by his denial. Christ the Lord was raised from the dead; out of his love he raised Peter. He questioned him about the love he was confessing, and entrusted him with his sheep. After all, what benefit could Peter confer on Christ, by the mere fact of his loving Christ? If Christ loves you, it's to your advantage, not Christ's; and if you love Christ, it's to your advantage, not Christ's. And yet Christ the Lord wanted to indicate in what way people ought to indicate that they love Christ, and he made it plain enough by entrusting him with his sheep. *Do you love me? I do. Feed my sheep* (Jn 21:15-17). All this once, all this a second time, all this a third time. Peter made no other reply than that he loved him; the Lord asked no other question but whether he loved him; when he answered, he did nothing else but entrust his sheep to him....

So let us love him, let there be nothing dearer to us than he. So do you imagine that the Lord is not questioning us? Was Peter the only one who qualified to be questioned, and didn't we? When that reading is read, every single Christian is being questioned in his heart. So when you hear the Lord saying, *Peter, do you love me?* think of it as a mirror, and observe yourself there. I mean, what else was Peter doing but standing for the Church? So when the Lord was questioning Peter, he was questioning us, he was questioning the Church.

FIRST COMMUNION PREP UPDATE By Monica Conrow

This past year in the Sacrament Prep program for First Holy Communion at our parish, the Ist and 2nd year students have been participating in a new hybrid model of formation. A hybrid model of catechesis has been growing in popularity around the country due to its success of invigorating the Catholic identity in the life of the family. With the family encouraged to engage in their Catholic faith in a deeper way, the children are more apt to embrace this identity as they grow into adulthood. This hybrid model consists of lessening classes of "Sunday School" for the children while working with the parents to increase Catholic living at home.

Parents of 2nd year students, whose children will be receiving First Holy Communion this May, have gathered periodically this year to have their own retreat-like evening for their own enrichment in faith. This has included a potluck dinner and a topic of focus for the gathering. The topics have covered: 1) Our Duty as Parents, 2) The Call to Holiness, 3) lesus at the Last Supper, and 4) His Divine Mercy.

Both students of 1st and 2nd year prep have been busy learning the tenets of the faith in class twice a month, with reinforcement help from parents. Each student is given memory cards of important topics covered in class and Catholic prayers to be learned at home. Of course, success of memorizing these cards deserves a reward! Other than the memory cards, families have been given homework of practical steps aiding them in increasing prayer life, spiritual reading and family service to the community.

Please pray for these young families as the children take the next step in their initiation into the Catholic faith – reception of their First Holy Communion on Saturday, May 18 at 11:00 am!
