

The Memorare Prayer

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known, that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thine intercession was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother; to thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

Significance of the prayer: This is a popular prayer to Our Blessed Virgin Mary to ask her for intercession for our sincere needs entrusting ourselves to her maternal love at the foot of her Son's cross.

History of the Memorare prayer: The prayer, traditionally attributed to St. Bernard of Clairvaux, gets its name from the first word of the original Latin prayer, meaning "Remember". However, the prayer as we know it today is actually found within a much larger prayer to the Virgin Mary entitled Ad sanctitatis tuae pedes, dulcissima Virgo Maria ("At your holy feet, most sweet Virgin Mary"). The Memorare was popularized by another Bernard, Fr. Claude Bernard, in the 17th century. Fr. Claude believed that the recitation of the prayer was the cause of his miraculous healing of a deathly illness. He printed over 200,000 leaflets with the prayer on it in different languages to distribute wherever he could.

Interesting facts about the prayer: St. Teresa of Calcutta used this prayer regularly. "This is the most beautiful prayer," Mother Teresa would say, as quoted by Father Kolodiejchuk who knew her well. "When we wanted to get a motherhouse, I promised Our Lady 85,000 Memorares. We were just very few sisters, and how to say so many Memorares? So we gathered all our poor children and all the people and taught them to say the Memorare — and soon we got this house." Oftentimes, she would resort to what is known as her "Flying Novena" which consisted of 9 Memorares in a row for an intention. Taking the collaboration of heaven so much for grated, she always added a 10th Memorare immediately in thanksgiving for the favor received.



Patience, which helps us to take trials and difficulties from the hands of God;


Humility, which helps us know ourselves and see that whatever is good in us comes from God;
