



Introduction to the Devout Life
By St. Francis de Sales







Francis de Sales's Introduction to the Devout Life has remained a uniquely accessible and relevant treasure of devotion for nearly four hundred years. As Bishop of Geneva in the first quarter of the seventeenth century, Francis de Sales saw to the spiritual needs of everyone from the poorest peasants to court ladies. The desire to be closer to God that he found in people from all levels of society led him to compile these instructions on how to live in Christ. Francis's compassionate Introduction leads the reader through practical ways of attaining a devout life without renouncing the world and offers prayers and meditations to strengthen devotion in the face of temptation and hardship.

### Math Program Development at St. Francis Catholic School


St. Francis Catholic School is continuing their efforts to update our mathematics curriculum throughout the school this year. We are piloting new mathematical programs and materials, which are proving to be a great addition to our curriculum. St. Francis Catholic School has introduced two excellent online mathematical programs to all grades levels. The first adaptive program is ALEKS, which is used in the middle school. This program keeps track and pinpoints areas of learning for individual students and the class, helping guide work for students in mathematics that is new and relevant to further developing their mathematical abilities for high school and college. Additionally, ALEKS is helping our students adapt to online testing in math. This is a skill that is new to our students, however it is valuable in a world where math testing is done online more and more through high school and college.

In grades K-5, Moby Max, a digital program is used. Moby Max is designed to extend mathematical skills from grades first through eighth. St. Francis Catholic School has used this program for multiple years at the middle school level. Commencing this school year, St. Francis Catholic School is using this program at all grade levels. This program will continue to increase learning of fact fluency, concept knowledge, and differentiated learning at all grade levels.

Moreover, in grades K-5 teachers are also piloting new mathematical programs. St. Francis Catholic School is looking for a strong alignment to 21st Century learning and a comprehensive standards-based curriculum. The new mathematics adoption will 'spiral concepts' in a continuous manner throughout the grades. Additionally, in middle school, the piloting of new materials in Algebra I class and eighth grade mathematics class are being reviewed, so all students will learn in a continuous and comprehensive manner.

It is an exciting year for mathematics at St. Francis Catholic School this year! We teachers all appreciate Ms. Gonzalez's guidance and enthusiasm for improvements in our mathematics programs now and in the coming years.
