



We are actively working on the Self-Study in-depth. The results of our parent survey and Catholic Identity surveys are in, and we are grateful and appreciative for the families who participated. As we have begun reviewing this valuable input to our school Self-Study process, we are finding the highest reason parents send their children to our school is for faith formation and academic excellence. For Wednesday's Mass on January 29<sup>th</sup> a hired videographer will be present to video the Mass, the Grandparents' Brunch, and activities throughout the day.
