
Welcome to Our Parish Family!

Arrangements are required at least three weeks in advance to schedule Baptisms. Baptisms are celebrated every Second and Fourth Sunday of the month at 1:30 p.m.

Baptism Godparents

One must be at least 14 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the Church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Godparent for Baptism. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

Penance/Reconciliation

Would you like to clean your heart and soul and begin a new journey with Christ? We invite you to participate in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation at the times specified in the front of this bulletin.

Holy Eucharist

We invite you to participate in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist daily at the times specified on the front of this bulletin. If you have not had the opportunity to make your Holy Eucharist, please contact Ms. Veronica Collingwood at the Parish Office or email her to make arrangements. Fourth Sunday of Easter

"Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and they asked Peter and the other apostles, 'What are we to do, my brothers?' Peter said to them, 'Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

First Reading: Acts 2:14a, 36-41

With great authority, Peter proclaims to the people that the Christ who was crucified is indeed the Messiah. Urging them to reform and be baptized in the name of Christ, three thousand responded to his words and were baptized.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:20b-25

This is a strong exhortation from Peter to the people to endure suffering for Christ as he did for them. Healed by his wounds, they have "returned to the shepherd."

Gospel: John 10:1-10

Christ uses the beautiful image of the shepherd to describe his care for his sheep. He also says he is the sheep gate and promises that "Whoever enters through me will be safe."

Pope Francis Living the Beatitudes

Most Reverend James F. Checchio Bishop of Metuchen



"Love the world that persecutes you"

"My Dear Brothers and Sisters:

The Holy Father noted that the happiness promised in this final Beatitude is the same as that of the first: The Kingdom of Heaven. "Thus, we understand that we have arrived at the end of a unified journey" that gradually unfolded as Christ proclaimed each succeeding Beatitude, the Pope explained. "The Path of the Beatitudes is an Easter journey that leads from a life according to the world to a life according to God".

So, the Pope said, when the world sees people living the beatitudes, there is discomfort that calls for a decision: either to be open to discussion and goodness; or "to refuse that light and harden the heart, even to the point of opposition and rage".

He warned us, though, that hearing the final Beatitude should not lead to a self-pitying attitude, or a victim mentality. When Christians are despised by others, it is not always synonymous with persecution. Sometimes we are at fault, he said, because "we have lost the taste of Christ and of the Gospel".

Pope Francis concluded by saying that facing exclusion and persecution, "if God grants us the grace", will make our lives resemble the life of Christ, who for our sake was "despised and rejected by men".

Adoption – especially the adoption of a newborn baby – almost always involves a loving, excited couple who have dreamed for years of holding and caring for their own special treasure.

Do mothers considering abortion realize that families actually go on waiting lists to adopt newborn babies? Do they realize that some couples wait years to adopt the baby they've desperately waited to hold in their arms? Do mothers realize how many experienced parents with wisdom, resources, and plenty of love are reaching out to adopt another child — no matter his or her race, gender, or disability?

We need to let mothers know that they can handpick their babies' adoptive families. They can choose an open adoption, where they see their babies at certain times throughout the year. They can choose a partially open adoption, where they receive photos and updates about their children's lives. Or they can choose a closed adoption and give their babies completely over to their adoptive families. We must let expectant mothers know that adoption is the loving, caring option.

CARES Act

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act

Did you know the CARES Act can help our local Church?

By providing key tax incentives for donors to non-profit organizations, the new legislation may encourage you to consider a financial gift to your parish, the Diocese of Metuchen or one of its entities.

. What is the CARES Act?

On Friday, March 27, Congress passed and the President signed into law the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. This is a \$2 trillion economic stimulus package legislated to provide immediate relief for nonprofits, businesses, individuals and state and local governments.

How does the CARES Act benefit donors to nonprofit organizations?

The CARES Act incentivizes charitable giving from individuals and corporations by increasing tax deductions for charitable donations.

· What are individual donor benefits?

All taxpayers (both those who itemize and those who use standard deduction) can deduct up to \$300 of total charitable contributions in 2020. Prior to the CARES Act, those who use standard deduction could not deduct any charitable giving.

What are the additional benefits for those who itemize their taxes?

The law lifts the existing cap on annual contributions for those who itemize their taxes, significantly raising it from 60% of adjusted gross income to 100% of adjusted gross income.

What are charitable giving incentives for corporations?

The CARES Act raises the annual limit of charitable giving that corporations can deduct from 10% of taxable income to 25% of taxable income.

Food donations from corporations are raised from 15% of taxable income to 25% of taxable income.
