



Hi everyone! This is Catherine Noel, and I am seventeen years old. Three and a half years ago I was diagnosed with Large Diffused B-Cell Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma. I underwent four rounds of chemotherapy and spent a lot of time in the hospital. Often, I felt lonely, depressed and wondered if I would ever get well. That's when I'd stop and remind myself that hundreds – even thousands – of people were praying for me all around the world. But most importantly, my parish family was. Nothing greater could have been done for me, for it was through your prayers and sacrifices that I am blessed to be alive today, and three years cancer free! Now, I want to give back – to you, and to God. The Make-A-Wish Foundation grants a wish to children who have gone through a life-threatening disease. For my wish, I chose to go to the heart of Christendom – Rome. There we will visit many churches and shrines and I want to pray for you and your intentions at each one. Every prayer, no matter how small, counts, and I want to try to do as much as I can for all that was done for me. In the back of church for the next few weeks, you can find a notebook in which I am taking intentions, and will bring to every church I visit in Rome, to touch to relics and holy sites while praying for you and your intentions. Even if you choose not to put anything, you are still in my prayers, as are the intentions in your heart. I love all of you dearly, my family in Christ. Thank you for making my miracle.



Presence to the Poor... Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy. Hope Clinic is also in need of various volunteers, especially nurses.



Feeding the hungry – donate items to the food pantry. Current needs are **canned fruit, corn, and peas; pasta meals in pull top cans; pasta sauce; cereal; tuna; peanut butter; and SOUP.**

Clothing the naked – When you donate items to Goodwill, ask for a Donation receipt and bring it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society. They are given credit for each bag of clothing given, which can be used to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

Alms for the poor – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter's. Supporting the St. Vincent de Paul Society during its 5th Sunday Collections and using the monthly envelope. Support other local agencies such as the Assistance House, Love Inc., and the Good Samaritan Food Pantry with monetary donations.

Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

September 27: St. Vincent de Paul, founder of the Vincentians, patron of charitable societies

Ordained a priest in 1600 at the tender age of 19, St. Vincent de Paul had a different beginning to his ministry than some might realize. In 1605, he was captured by pirates and sold into slavery. He obtained his freedom 2 years later (after converting his owner) and returned to France. After seeing the state of the poor, where it was common to see people dying of starvation if they were unable to find work, he took action. He worked tirelessly for the poor. He founded religious congregations, preached missions and established seminaries and hospitals. He was truly a laborer in the vineyard of the Lord. RECIPE: Poor Man's Caviar (from catholiccuisine.com)

Ingredients:

1/2 onion, chopped	1 green bell pepper, chopped
1 bunch green onions, chopped	2 jalapeno peppers, chopped
1 T minced garlic	1 pint cherry tomatoes, quartered
1/4 c olive oil	15 oz black beans, drained
15 oz can black-eyed peas, drained	1 bunch chopped fresh cilantro
Salt and pepper (to taste)	



Directions: In a large bowl, mix together all the ingredients, except the cilantro and chill about 2 hours. Toss with desired amount of cilantro and serve. A nice loaf of warm French bread completes the meal!
