A reminder from the Catechism about the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit:

The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. They belong in their fullness to Christ, Son of David. They complete and perfect the virtues of those who receive them. They make the faithful docile in readily obeying divine inspirations. (CCC 1831)

The fruits of the Spirit are perfections that the Holy Spirit forms in us as the first fruits of eternal glory. The tradition of the Church lists twelve of them: "charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity." (CCC 1832)

May we pray that all of us be open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit and as docile and willing as the Blessed Mother Mary. Mother Mary, Spouse of the Holy Spirit, Pray for Us!





# The Visitation of The Blessed Virgin Mary (May 31st)

When the Angel Gabriel announced to the Virgin Mary that she was to conceive the child Jesus in her womb, her reply was "How shall this be, as I know not man?", to which Gabriel responded with the extraordinary news that her cousin Elizabeth had conceived of a child in her old age and was 6 months along already. Although this news could have been construed as simple proof of the truth of the Angel's message, Mary went "...in haste..." to visit her cousin, not to verify the truth of the Angel's words but in an act of love and service born of the Supreme act of love of the Incarnation that had just occurred in her – Love begets love, and Mary is our prime example of this. The picture to the right depicts the moment of Mary's arrival at the home of Elizabeth and their mutual joy and celebration of one another's presence and pregnancy. Mary arrived at her cousin's home to be of service to Elizabeth in her time of need, but also to celebrate the Love and Mercy of God that had been bestowed upon them both in superabundance. Thus Mary is also our example of the Joy and Celebration that should flow naturally from us as a result of the Love and Mercy God constantly pours into our lives. Take some time this week to consider how you can share the Love and Mercy of God with your relatives, neighbours or friends, perhaps even with a "visit" in imitation of our Lady. (Bring along some blueberry muffins – recipe below.)

# FEASTING WITH THE SAINTS

#### **Visiting Blueberry Muffins**

3 cups all-purpose flour

- 1 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 teaspoons baking powder
- 2/3 cup vegetable oil
- 2 eggs
- 2/3 cup milk
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 3 cup fresh or frozen blueberries

Crumb Topping: 2/3 cup brown sugar 1/4 cup all-purpose flour 3 Tbs. butter, cubed



Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C). Spray muffin pan with Pam or other non-stick spray or line with muffin liners. Combine flour, sugar, salt and baking powder in large bowl. In a 2-cup measuring cup, place vegetable oil, eggs, vanilla, and enough milk (just over 2/3 cups) to fill to the 2-cup mark. Mix this with flour mixture. Fold in blueberries. (Note: The batter is extremely thick.) Fill muffin cups right to the top for oversized muffins. To make the crumb topping: mix together 2/3 cup brown sugar, 1/4 cup flour, 3 Tbs. butter, and 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon. Mix with a fork, and sprinkle over muffins before baking. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes in the preheated oven, or until done. This recipes yields approximately 12-16 extra generously sized delicious muffins.
