A Word from your Pastor:

Dear Parishioners:

As time goes on, we are hoping to be able to “return” to a new kind of normalcy in our life together as Church. None of us knows just what will happen, but we do know that we are in this together and we will work it out together. I have been listening very carefully to all that is being said formally and informally about the best way to proceed with our “return,” ensuring that we are all kept safe. As I have shared, as a diabetic, I am among those who are “high risk” with a secondary condition, so I am in this both personally and as one responsible for the health and safety of others.

In regard to church practices, we are under the direct guidance and authority of the Diocese of Columbus. This means that Bishop Robert Brennan and his staff keep in close contact with us in regard to developments and in the setting of guidelines. We have received information that told us we can consider ourselves as being in a “phase two” of return. This has allowed for a gradual re-introduction of some practices (for example, singing), while continuing others that keep us all safer (wearing masks, social distancing, and sanitizing) and still refraining from others (not using hymnals, not sharing the Sign of Peace in church and not having distribution of Holy Communion from the chalice). We have also been permitted to have some groups connected with the parish gather again, keeping all the protocols and signing a release form supplied by the Diocese of Columbus that acknowledges awareness of the risks.

Pastors, clergy, parish staffs and leaders are all working together to find a way to do what we are called to do as Church while following reasonable precautions. Of course, there are always differences of opinion as to what should be done. Each parish has to find its own path.

What helps is for all of us to put our trust in God, in one another and for each of us to cooperate with the path chosen and what we consider best for our own health. For now, the bishops of Ohio have continued the dispensation from obligation for Mass attendance and they suggest that we find ways to build community that are respectful of needs and concerns.


What does not help (in this matter or in any other!) is for us to be alarmist, allowing fear to dominate our actions. There can be honest disagreements and choices by individuals that must be respected. We must all pray that the pandemic comes to an end and that we find a way to rebuild trust and cooperation among all.

How we respond to this together will make all the difference. We can change the world when we choose to change our own attitudes and behaviors. May Jesus always be our model. May we follow St. Paul’s advice this weekend: *“Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but also for those of others. Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus.”*

NOTES FROM THE DIOCESE OF COLUMBUS CONCERNING COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

We should be in the mindset that the first phase of the return is now over, and we are prudently moving toward normalcy while maintaining precautions for the health of those in church or any gathering of people based on the best healthcare knowledge available.

MASKS: Face coverings should be worn inside churches and in other parish facilities. This is in keeping with the best knowledge available for the slowing down of the spread of the virus, and with the executive order of the governor. Personal safety by keeping a safe social distance is still the best approach to reducing the spread.

DISPENSATION: The dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation has been extended indefinitely. This is in keeping with the rest of the Ohio Catholic Conference of Catholic Bishops. Those who are feeling well and who are not in the high-risk categories should be encouraged to come to Mass. Those who are in the high-risk categories, or who are not feeling well are encouraged to remain home.

This encouragement is meant to help people who are unsure or uncertain about coming to Mass during this time. While we encourage parishioners to come to Mass during the time of dispensation, we should continue to implement the normal healthcare guidelines such as maintaining social distancing by marking off pews, wearing facemasks, sanitizing pews, and making hand sanitizer available. During this dispensation, parishioners may choose to assist at a Mass during the week, if they are able. Doing so would free up space in church on the weekend for those who desire to come to Mass but are unable to during the week. Additionally, assisting at a weekend Mass could simply be occasional by the healthy individual during the dispensation.



Parish Notes for All

This week, just a few notes for all the parishes as a reminder of what we must do in common as we gather during this time of pandemic.

1. For all church and parish gatherings, we must follow the protocols set in place by the Diocese of Columbus. This means the congregation wearing a mask and keeping social distance, sanitizing after use of the church and other parish facilities, etc. The Diocese is strict about this for all events on parish properties, including funerals, weddings, meetings, etc.
2. Not coming to church or other activities if there are any symptoms that might cause others to worry. If you are feeling ill in any way, please remain at home. We are grateful that we have livestream available for our weekend and daily Masses, so you can be present in spirit and participate in that way even if you cannot come to church.
3. Showing respect for others by choosing places that allow for social distance. If a family group is in a pew together, that is alright as long as it doesn't push someone else already seated out. If there are latecomers, they ought to choose a different place if necessary.
4. The Bishop has indicated a preference during this time for Holy Communion to be received in the hand; however, it has **not** been forbidden to receive on the tongue. If someone does prefer to receive on the tongue, the priests, deacon and other ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize before continuing to distribute to the next person. When you approach the Communion station, please remove your mask before receiving and receive immediately after you have been given the Host. This is how we show reverence and respect for the Eucharistic Lord.
5. All the parishes of the Consortium are in need of assistance at Masses to fill in for various needs and ministries due to the fact that some of our usual ministers are compromised or not able to attend. Ushers are needed to help to find places and to ensure that all have masks to wear. Helpers to sanitize after Mass and to prepare spaces for meetings and to sanitize afterwards are also needed. All groups that choose to meet are responsible for seeing that proper protocols and cleanup and sanitizing take place or the right to meet will be forfeited.

The clergy and staff offer sincere thanks to all for your cooperation with these matters. How we respond together in this time of crisis is a real sign to the world of what Christ has to offer. May we be a worthy witness to His Love and Mercy so all the world will come to Him.
