A Word From Your Pastor:

Dear Parishioners:

The Commandments of God are very familiar to all of us. As you probably learned in your catechism classes, they have two parts: those addressing our relationship with God (Commandments 1-3) and those addressing our relationship with other human beings (Commandments 4-10).

You may have noticed that different Christian denominations divide the Commandments a bit differently. Our First Commandment contains what others put down as two separate Commandments and our version of Commandments 9 and 10 are put down as one Commandment in theirs. They come to us in two different versions in the Bible: the one that is our First Reading from Exodus 20, and the other in Leviticus 19. When we have more than one version of something in the Bible, it is an interesting exercise to study the differences. We learn that the Bible itself invites an application of its teaching in different circumstances. Don't be fooled into thinking that the Church "changed" or "left out" God's commands. We have simply understood them through the lens of Jesus Christ and the life of the Church.

The Gospel about the money-changers being expelled from the Temple by Jesus is a vivid example that some ways of interpreting the Law of God are not in accord with God's plan for His People. We need to make sure that we make room both for God, having Him as First in our lives, and for others, who are all the objects of God's Love and Mercy before Judgment. It is very important to have priorities straight in our lives.

I want to thank all those who have already responded to the Catholic Leadership Institute survey. If you have not yet done so, please make a point to respond, either online or by using the printed form. This information will be very helpful for us to determine how to plan to build up our role as disciples of the Lord as we begin our return from Covid time.



Celebrating 175 years!

In the history books?

(Thanks to parishioner Jim Anderson for his research in locating these interesting events/facts in our parish history)

April 17, 1867: *The Catholic Telegraph*, Cincinnati, OH Chillicothe.

Passion Sunday, 1867, will long be remembered by the worthy Catholics of Chillicothe. In the forenoon the children of St. Peter's German, under the zealous pastoral care of Rev. Edward Lieb, made their first Communion at the hands of the Most Rev. Archbishop, and in the afternoon seventy of this congregation and forty of St. Mary's were confirmed. The solemn Mass was celebrated by Rev. Mr. Specht, of Holy Cross, Columbus, Rev. Mr. Lieb and Rev. Mr. Murray, pastor of St. Mary's being Deacon and sub-Deacon. After Vespers and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, the procession was formed, composed of both congregations, headed by the Holy Cross, a band of music and the flag of the Union, followed by banners of the religious societies. It was the largest assemblage seen in the streets 'since the Morgan raid."

Arriving at the site of the new church of St. Mary, English, the Archbishop blessed and placed the corner stone.

The foundations are a superior piece of massive cut stone masonry for a church 130 by 60 feet. After the ceremony the Archbishop addressed the large and attentive audience for an hour, presenting such reflections as the divinely assisted progress of the Catholic Church, and its, to his hearers, eventful history in this diocese and especially in Chillicothe, suggested. The subject and the statements made called for lively gratitude to God and inspired encouragement and hope. One of the most pleasing features of the bright scene was exhibited by the great number of beautiful little school girls and others robed in purest white and singing the Divine praises. The Sisters of Notre Dame, who sold their beautiful property to the St. Mary's congregation, are anxiously expected to return and take charge of the girls' schools of both churches.

One Sunday morning, Delma came back to the Sacristy after Mass with a big, bright smile on her face. It was a sunny day and I thought she was just cheerful due to the change in weather. I said: "You look happy!" She said, "We had children! Did you see how many children were at Mass today?" It was truly a delight to see so many families with their children in church. Only a minute later, an usher came into the sacristy with the report: "We had 72 parishioners in church today!" Later that evening, in a conversation with some other priests, the Scriptural association of that number dawned on me: after the 12, Jesus sent out 72 disciples to prepare the way for Him. So, praise God, we have had 72 "back in church." May our community continue to move in this direction as we go forward toward the days beyond Covid.

St. Peter Church in Chillicothe

A recent financial review pointed out some good news and bad news. The good news is that we are able to be current on our bills due to some resources we have had on hand and due to the relief supplied by P.P.P. funds in the first Covid season. The bad news is that although some giving has increased – enough to make us ineligible for the second P.P.P. loan – our Stewardship, that is, the Sunday Offerings, are still down enough to have an effect. We are not meeting budget and the Covid situation is not improving quickly enough to allow us to spring back before the end of the fiscal year. The White Christmas we had gave quite a hit to our usual end-of-the-year "Christmas bailout." In short, we expect to be short. If you have an opportunity to increase your giving to help us, we would be most grateful.

We have a farewell to say to our Maintenance man, Tom Haynes, who is retiring after many years of service at St. Peter and St. Mary, Queen of the Missions. He will still be around from time to time to assist on special projects that were already planned. We thank Tom for his service!

Plans were set to have some of our liturgical items refurbished through Generations in Columbus. An updated bid has been obtained since it has been a few years and the Finance Council has decided to go forward with this. Memorial Donations in honor of Jim Streitenberger will cover a large portion of this. This year's Bishop's Annual Appeal parish goal will include the remainder, but other donations toward this are also welcome.

We thank Jerry Meier for his many years of serving as Chair for the Finance Council and Bob Lagnese for taking up the responsibility. We also welcome Jamie Streitenberger and Tony Skowronek for joining the Council. I am very impressed with the manner in which they have addressed the needs of the parish, especially with ensuring that the grounds and the buildings are being taken care of properly. Discussion of creating the possibility for attracting younger families to greater involvement in the life of the parish has begun. Perhaps you have some thoughts concerning how to do this?
