

A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

The Wedding Feast of Cana is the first public event after Jesus' Baptism by John where there is a major "breakthrough" in the life of the first disciples. At the end of the reading, we are told that Jesus "revealed His glory" and that "His disciples began to believe in Him." This event is part of the Epiphany "trifecta," in which the glory of the Lord breaks through in our human nature. The arrival of the Magi, the Baptism of the Lord, and the Wedding Feast of Cana are recalled from the Epiphany until the Baptism of the Lord, and in Year C, the mystery celebrated "overflows" into the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The Feast at Cana offers some wonderful opportunity for reflection on the manner in which God chooses to work among us. First, it must be noted that Jesus is at Cana with His Mother; it is a family event. Then, He brings along His fledgling disciples. They have not yet begun to see the depth that is in Him. The occasion of the first public manifestation of His glory is an occasion of human limitation. "They have no wine." That is all Mary says to Jesus. She does not enter into a discussion. She does not beg. Her faith in Him leads her merely to instruct the servers to "Do whatever He tells you."

Our emptiness and brokenness are the very "places" where glory is revealed. We are called to believe in the power of the Lord and to apply it to our interactions with one another and with the circumstances in which we find ourselves. Jesus offers salvation to all. Our oneness with God through Him and our unity as human beings are central to the truth of our Faith in Jesus. Mary shows us how to offer Jesus to the world: we acknowledge the need and get out of the way. We supply whatever means are available to us to meet the needs we see, but then we put our trust in the Lord.

Our lives as families are meant to be the precise place where Faith is expressed. The first experience of Church is the Domestic Church, the Church alive in the Home. Our life together as the community of believers is designed by the Lord Himself to form us as disciples who see His glory and grow in Faith together.



Fr. Stinnett's Scribbles

Next Sunday is the third time that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time will be celebrated as the Sunday of the Word of God. Pope Francis, in the letter issued motu proprio entitled Aperuit Illis, wanted to establish a special day "given over entirely to the word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and His people." This liturgical year, our encounter with Jesus Christ, the Word of God Himself, will be facilitated through the writings of St. Luke, as we begin Cycle C of the lectionary. In fact, the Latin title of the Pope's letter comes from St. Luke's Gospel, from the account of the appearance to the disciples after the Resurrection, when He "opened their minds to the Scriptures" (Lk 24:45). To help us better understand and appreciate the 'inexhaustible riches' of the face of Jesus presented to us this year, the face painted by St. Luke, and of the early Church in the Acts of the Apostles, I would like to give a short biography of St. Luke, through the Tradition of the Eastern Church, which has a much livelier hagiographical tradition than we do in the West.

St. Luke was born to Gentile parents in the city of Antioch in Syria. He is distinguished from those who are "of the circumcision" by St. Paul in his Letter to the Colossians (Col 4:10-15). Luke received an excellent education in a variety of subjects, including language, medicine, and the arts. In that same passage from Colossians, St. Paul confirms this by referring to Luke as a physician. The quality of Luke's Greek is better than any other writer of the New Testament. At some point as a young adult, Luke learned the customs of the Jews - and may have been somewhere in the process of converting to Judaism - when he began hearing of the great deeds and miracles of a new teacher down in Galilee, a certain Jesus of Nazareth. Intrigued by this news, Luke went to see Him. He was counted as one of the 70 disciples whom Jesus sent out with power to proclaim the Gospel and to heal the sick. St. Luke is proof that once a gift is given by the Lord, He does not take it away, as these two gifts would be a part of the rest of St. Luke's life. All disciples of Christ are, at the heart of things, witnesses to Jesus' Resurrection, the definitive Good News and proof of salvation. We see in the account of the Road to Emmaus, which is unique to St. Luke's Gospel, that one of the disciples is named Cleopas, and the other goes unnamed. This unnamed disciple is, according to the tradition, St. Luke himself. After the Resurrection, St. Luke became a travelling companion of St. Paul, testified to in St. Paul's letters, as well as the passages of the Acts of the Apostles that switch over from third person narration to first person narration (Acts 17ff). St. Luke remained a constant companion of St. Paul for the rest of St. Paul's life, accompanying him during his imprisonment, first in Jerusalem and then in Rome. It was in Rome that St. Luke wrote both his Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, pulling from his own experiences with Jesus, and those of other disciples in Rome.

After St. Paul's martyrdom, St. Luke went out to evangelize the Roman Empire, travelling through Italy, Gaul, Macedonia, and Egypt. I suppose we could see it as a book tour of sorts, bringing to people throughout the Roman Empire the Good News of Jesus Christ. While ministering to the Greeks, primarily in the city of Boetia, St. Luke died a martyr by being crucified on an olive tree at the age of 84. His relics were eventually transferred to Constantinople, and many healings took place through them, attesting to his gift of healing, both from Christ and from his training as a physician.

Lastly, St. Luke is known as a painter, having been the first to paint an icon of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We see the qualities of St. Luke present in his Gospel, his refined skills as an author, his emphasis on Christ the Divine Healer, and the beauty of the humanity of Jesus, especially through the many parables of Jesus that are unique to St. Luke.




