A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

This past week, I observed the 37th anniversary of my priestly ordination. As I have shared before, I am happy to be a priest. We have experienced many challenges since 1985, and with all honesty, the challenges I have experienced since the death of my mother in 2019 have been the most intense. Yet, without any equivocation, I am happy to say that priesthood has been the greatest gift of God to me after life itself. I would not trade it for any other life.

Since January 1996, I have served as a pastor. Each place has brought its own adventures and challenges, but in each place I have learned more about God and myself and about God's mysterious ways among His People. I had no idea what each pastoral situation I have encountered would bring, but I have trusted that the Holy Spirit would open my eyes and heart if I persevered in the responsibilities entrusted to me. Life as a priest and a pastor has truly been an adventure.

One experience that has happened since my arrival in Chillicothe in the midst of Covid Time that has been very positive and new has been that of sharing a diverse household in our common rectory. Fr. Milton and I arrived in July of 2020 to share a household with Fr. Beal and two seminarians who had been there with Fr. Hahn. We had a summer of a "full house" of three priests and two seminarians. When the fall arrived, the three priests continued what we had done with the seminarians, making sure to take time to form a community of prayer, laughing together, and working to meet the needs of the people under Covid restrictions.

When Fr. Beal was called to become a pastor, I made a bold move and told the Bishop and the Vocations Director that we would be happy to have a pastoral intern through the year in addition to the summer custom. So that set the scene for a year of a household of four, with the newly ordained Fr. Jacob Stinnett and seminarian intern David Johnstone. Once again, we had a wonderful experience of fraternity and collaborating in meeting the needs of three parishes and a school. What a blessing it has been for us!

I have told brother priests and many others that these past two years have been the happiest of my life in regard to the experience of rectory living. In spite of age differences and generation gaps, we have found a way to share the life of the Gospel. I am so happy to be able to say this, because there are many who have very different experiences. This gives me hope for the Church and hope for our Consortium of parishes. We will find a way to live and proclaim the Gospel no matter what the future may bring.

The Jubilee officially concluded on the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter in February, when we also had a delightful Mardi Gras.

Fr. Stinnett's Scribbles

As I am sure you have picked up on by now, I always use the same Eucharistic Prayer at every Mass. This is for a couple of reasons. The Roman Canon, as Eucharistic Prayer I is sometimes called, has the best imagery from Scripture and Tradition. None of the other options mentions as many saints as the Roman Canon. None of the other options makes as many allusions to Scripture as the Roman Canon. The past few weeks as I have been celebrating Mass, I have been pondering one of the sentences that appears just after the Consecration of the gifts into the Body and Blood of Christ. The priest prays, "Be pleased to look upon these offerings with a serene and kindly countenance, and to accept them as once You were pleased to accept the gifts of Your servant Abel, the just; the sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith; and the offering of Your high priest Melchizedek..."

My question is, why did the Church pick these sacrifices of the Old Testament to mention in the Eucharistic Prayer instead of all the others? Nothing is mentioned of the sacrifices of the Passover, and yet Jesus is inaugurating the "new and eternal covenant," a new Passover. St. Paul even refers to Jesus as such in his First Letter to the Corinthians (cf. 5:7). From what I have been able to reflect upon, all three of these sacrifices from the Old Testament look forward to the sacrifice of Christ. Together, they bring together three elements that make the one sacrifice of Christ unique and unrepeatable. This week, let's look at the first one mentioned in the Roman Canon, the sacrifice of Abel, the just.

The sacrifice of Abel is the sacrifice of a lamb. Jesus is the Lamb of God. He is called this by St. John the Baptist and by St. John the Evangelist throughout the Book of Revelation. Abel also has a pure intention by his sacrifice. St. Cyprian notes that when God accepts a sacrifice, He looks not only at the offering, but also at the heart of the one making the offering. Abel's heart was more pure and peaceable than Cain's, as demonstrated by Cain's actions immediately after they both tried to offer sacrifice to God. Abel has the right intention in his sacrifice to God. This is why he is called "the just." Cyprian says that Abel is a model for all of us to follow when we bring our sacrifices to God. They are not to be simply routine, thoughtless actions, but they are to be done in the spirit of humility, piety, and love. Jesus reminds us of this in the Sermon on the Mount: "Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift" (Mt 5:23-34).

The last thing to be noted about Abel's sacrifice is what happens afterward. His brother Cain's sacrifice is not accepted by God. In a fit of jealousy, Cain murders Abel and then tries to cover it up when God confronts him and gives him an opportunity to repent. Part of being righteous, of being just as Abel was, is being willing to suffer ourselves, to make a sacrifice of ourselves, too. Cyprian says, "He sacrificed in such a way, and so he was worthy to become, afterwards, himself a sacrifice to God: he who bore witness through the first martyrdom, who initiated the Lord's passion by the glory of his blood, had both the Lord's righteousness and the Lord's peace. Such are those who are crowned by the Lord at the end; such are those who will sit and judge with him on the day of judgement."
