### A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR:

Dear Parishioners:

The month of February will bring many things for us to address together. No doubt the weather will play with us as it always does in Ohio: sunshine, snow, rain, warm weather, cold weather, freezing weather, etc. News will come out from the Diocese of Columbus next week that will be a surprise to all of us in many different ways. Within a couple of weeks, we will enter into the Season of Lent. Our Faith has given us the capacity to respond to anything we have to face with trust in the Lord.

We must make three simple choices: We must want what God wants, putting His will at the top of our agenda. We must keep our eyes fixed on the goal that God has set for us: holiness of life and the hope of Eternity. Finally, we must choose to work together, acknowledging that we are a family entrusted with the mission of bringing Christ to the world and the world to Christ.

This month, to assist us on our way, we begin "The Rescue Project," which has been in preparation for many months. It is a wonderful sign of our desire to grow that our first effort reached the point of having a "waiting list." Once we are through the effort for the first time, we will be able to run it again and at different times and locations. It is designed to raise up practical evangelists. Those who hear the Gospel and allow it to transform them are the witnesses needed to draw others to Jesus, which is the entire purpose for the existence of the Church in the world.

We are rescued by God's Love revealed to us in Jesus Christ. Together with Christ and with the other members of His Body, we are called to rescue the world from its downward spiral. Our starting point must be Unity. Oneness with God that is real flows out into unity with our neighbor. Each person we encounter is a candidate for hearing the Good News.

Jesus tells us that our light must shine before others so that they may see our good deeds and give glory to God. We are called to be salt and light, bringing the Life of God among us. Are you responding to the grace that is offered to you? Who is waiting to hear the invitation from you?

Please stay tuned for more news from the Diocese of Columbus, and be ready to move forward with the plans soon to be revealed!





Divine Mercy Minute – by Judy Harness

Recently, a good friend to me and to many in our consortium, parishioner Robin Beery sent me an unexpected text message sharing a story about the power of the Divine Mercy. With her permission, I am sharing her story as she shared it with me: "I have to tell you about the divine experience I had with my mother's death today. She's been in hospice for less than a month, but she was declining rapidly. They moved her to a private room with

pain meds yesterday. Kelli and I spent the night there, and I was there all day today. Anyway, it was like she would not let go (her mother). I had already prayed a Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet earlier in the day. Kelli decided to leave, so I was alone with her. At around 2:45 p.m., I prayed another Rosary, and very close to 3:00 p.m., I began the Chaplet. I talked to her, and I asked Jesus to shower her with His Mercy. She passed at 3:09 p.m. I have never felt such peace!"

The missionaries of the Divine Mercy in our consortium share the same mission that St. Faustina had: "God and Souls!" Our Lord asked St. Faustina to pray and offer the Chaplet for sinners and the dying, saying:

Pray as much as you can for the dying. By your entreaties (that is, insistent prayers), obtain for them trust in My mercy, because they have most need of trust, and have it the least. Be assured that the grace of eternal salvation for certain solus in their final moment depends on your prayer. You know the whole abyss of My mercy, so draw upon it for yourself and especially for poor sinners. Sooner would heaven and earth turn into nothingness than would My mercy not embrace a trusting soul. (Diary, 1777)
