

The Sacrament of Confirmation

- Gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross
- Increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us (wisdom, counsel, courage, understanding, piety, knowledge, awe & wonder)
- Helps us to know we are loved and forever belong to God's family, the Church. (Catechism of the Catholic Church Paragraph 1303)

The Sacrament of Confirmation is based in Scripture

"But you shall receive **power** when the **Holy Spirit** has come upon you; and you shall be my **witnesses** in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth" - Acts 1:8 (Jesus speaking to his Apostles before he returned to heaven.)

"Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent to them Peter and John, who came down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit; for it had not yet fallen on any of them, but they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit" – Acts 8:14–17





In order to guarantee our spots for the Confirmation retreat we need to know by **Thursday, August 1st** whether or not you'd would like to register your son or daughter for this retreat.



The Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy are the way in which we as Christians for over 2,000 years have been living as authentic witnesses of Jesus Christ to the world around us. Both the Spiritual and the Corporal works of Mercy are of great importance for the Christian life.

Jesus is so clear in the Gospel of Matthew that whatever we do to the poor we do to him (Matthew 25:34–40). God cares about our physical and spiritual needs. God has sent us to take care of one another and share what we have been given.

We are inviting you as a family, and especially your sons and daughters preparing for Confirmation, to begin practicing these works of mercy more intentionally. Feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick. And while the spiritual works of mercy can be daunting at first, remember that it may not be as difficult as you think to comfort the sorrowful, pray for the living and the dead, share with others the truths of our faith (instruct the ignorant), and be honest with yourself and others when they are choosing things that aren't good for them (admonishing the sinner).

Your child is required to complete 10 hours of corporal works of mercy and 10 hours of spiritual works of mercy for a total of 20 service hours. Your child is not not required to complete service hours for every corporal and spiritual work of mercy, but they are required to focus on at least 2 different corporal and 2 different spiritual works of mercy in their service hours.

Some corporal works of mercy don't make sense for 7th and 8th graders to do in a completely literal sense. For example, unless there is a way to do it safely I'm not asking your children to begin prison ministry or bury the dead. However, you can be creative with care packages for prisoners or making and laying wreaths on the graves of veterans in a cemetery. Similarly, it doesn't quite fit to document when they have born wrongs patiently or forgive offenses willingly on service hour log, so talk about what it looks like to live those spiritual works of mercy in your day to day family/ school life and focus on sharing about truths of the faith (instructing the ignorant) by volunteering to help with younger children during our parish Totus Tuus July 22nd-26th, 2025 or creating interactive ways to pray for the living and the dead, or spending time comforting the sorrowful by spending time with those who are lonely and sad.

WHO CAN BE MY CHILD'S SPONSOR?

The role of the Sponsor is to assist in presenting the candidate for Confirmation and to help the candidate live a Christian life befitting the baptized. The following are the requirements according to Canon Law, paragraphs 872–874.

- 1. Sponsors must be willing to provide spiritual guidance to the child. They may not be the mother or father of the person to be confirmed.
- 2. Sponsors must be age 16 or older, unless the parish priest considers that there is a just reason for an exception to be made.
- 3. Sponsors must be fully initiated Catholics (one who has celebrated Baptism, Eucharistic, Confirmation and practices their faith).
- 4. Sponsors must be actively practicing their Catholic faith and living as an authentic witnesses of Christ in accordance with the teachings of the Church.* If the person you are considering as a sponsor is not married according to the laws and practices of the Catholic Church, or is cohabitating [living together without marriage], they are not able to sponsor your child as they are not currently able to be practicing, authentic witnesses of Christ and his Church. Catholics who are divorced and remarried, and whose previous marriage has not been annulled by a Decree of Invalidity are considered members of the Church living in an irregular (or invalid) marriage and as such, are not eligible to be a Godparent or Confirmation sponsor.* Our priests are happy to meet with anyone seeking an annulment or convalidation. We want help all people be able to receive all the graces available to them through the sacraments.
- 4. A Sponsor must be an active, registered member of a Catholic Parish. If the Sponsor is over 18, the person must be registered under their own name at a Catholic Parish. For those who are not parishioners of St Mary or St. Peter's Church, the Sponsors must complete the sponsor sheet and have it signed his/her parish indicating that he/she is a Catholic in good standing. The certificate should be mailed to the Parish Office no later than **December 10th, 2023**.
- 5. If a sponsors is unable to be at the Confirmation a sponsor may be represented by a proxy. If you plan to have a proxy, he/she must be a practicing Roman Catholic in good standing.
