

#### Seeking St. Philip's School alumni

In August 1960, at the request of Washington Archbishop Patrick O'Boyle and St. Philip's Pastor, Father Joseph Teletchea, the Bernardine Sisters arrived in Suitland to prepare for the opening of St. Philip's School. The Bernardines, a branch of the Franciscan Third Order, founded La Reine High School on Silver Hill Road, next to Suitland HS.

Though construction was still underway, St. Philip's School officially opened Sept. 19, 1960 with 1st and 2nd grades in an unoccupied wing of La Reine. (My son Mike was in the 2nd grade, daughter Therese in 1st.) The newlyconstructed St. Philip's School finally opened in 1962.

Next September marks St. Philip's 60th anniversary.
