FROM THE DESK OF DEACON KELLEY

Many crowds listened to Jesus as he spoke to them in the Sermon on the Mount. He had just concluded speaking about the beatitudes. Our gospel today shows us how to go about "Walking in the Spirit of God." There are three things that we need to do to Walk in the Spirit of God. First, let's spiritually renew ourselves. We can spiritually renew ourselves as we begin to follow the beatitudes and walk with the poor – walk with the homeless – walk with those who mourn and walk with those who are in need. Some people in need are right here at St. Philip the Apostle. Let's get to know one another and pray for one another. Reach out to someone here that you don't know and get to know them. Second, let's spice up our lives. Jesus said to his disciples – you are the salt of the earth. Jesus is talking to us too. We are the salt of the earth. We must get out of our comfort zones and go and spice up the community around us. Let's add some spice to this community so that we don't lose our taste. Lastly, let's share ourselves. In times of opportunity - share your faith with others. Turn on your light – the light of your soul. Many people have no idea of the beauty of Catholicism. They don't know about the opportunity of seeking the intercession of Mary and the saints. They don't know the wonderful prayers of the Church. They don't know of the peacefulness we experience in Eucharistic Adoration. They don't know of the mercy of God in the confessional and the relief one feels after receiving absolution from sin from the priest. They don't know about the beauty of the Mass. They don't know that the source and summit of our faith is receiving Jesus in the Eucharist – body, blood, soul and divinity. They don't know that receiving Jesus in the Eucharist allows us to go out among society and show them Jesus. Jesus says, "You are the light of the world...Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father."

Remembering St. Philip's School's early years - part VI

Fr. Francis Dolan was assigned to St. Philip's Parish in 1968 and could often be seen during the school lunch hour playing basketball with the kids (we had a net at one side of the parking lot). But those games ended forever on Jan. 31, 1971 when Fr. Dolan suffered a heart attack and died, while playing basketball with parish teens at Benjamin D. Foulois School in Morningside. He was only 42. A memorial plaque is on the back wall of the confessional.

In the late '70s the school was enlarged with two new classrooms at the end of the classroom wing. The Social Hall and new kitchen were added at the same time. The former 1st grade became the library. The old library (now the school office), became the faculty room and still later a computer classroom, overseen by Sr. Annelle.
