Mass with Healing Prayers

Saint Philip's offers a monthly Mass with Healing Prayers on the third Tuesday of every month beginning at 7:00pm in the church.

What is the atmosphere like during the healing prayers?

The atmosphere is one of great reverence, in which the primary focus is on the sacredness of the Blessed Sacrament, and is maintained through prayerful and meditative music and silent Eucharistic Adoration. Traditional practices for solemn Exposition and Benediction follows. Because of the solemnity of the atmosphere, and the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, modest dress is appropriate.

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER LEWIS

In today's First Reading from the Book of Sirach, the author describes God's power and majesty. He writes, "Immense is the wisdom of the Lord; he is mighty in power, and all-seeing." If God is allseeing, all-knowing, and all-wise, then we had better follow his commands. It would be foolish to take the risk of leading a life of sin, when Jesus himself guides us to the path of virtue. In his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus lays out the law of charity, which is ratified in his own body and blood. In today's passage, Jesus talks about how we must use our gift of sight and our gift of speech. Do we use our vision to look lustfully on the world? Or do we seek to praise and find God in all things we look upon? Do we use our words to curse and insult and judge our neighbor? Or do we speak of Godly things? This week, we're invited to admit where we've fallen short that we might get back on the Lord's path. Jesus reveals the path to peace and eternal life – and, through the power of the sacraments, he pours out the grace that will enable us to walk it.

Remembering St. Philip's School's early years -part VII

Fr. Joseph Teletchea, our founding pastor, became monsignor in 1971 and four years later was transferred to St. Jerome's in Hyattsville. Fr. Oliver Mahedy was tapped to be our new pastor. Fr. Oliver McGready was our assistant pastor at the time, which means we had two Olivers, one from Ireland and one from Northern Ireland.

Dante Ross entered the Permanent Deaconate program, was ordained Sept. 11, 1971 and assigned to St. Philip's. In addition to his responsibilities as Deacon, he continued to work with the Parents Club, which he had founded.

During the late 1970s and into the '80s, we had our own school bus. After a minor accident on an icy Skyline Drive, the bus was discontinued.

In 1972 Kathleen Giroux initiated a physical education program. In the late '80s students started wearing gym uniforms. In the early '90s the school began to hire instructors and Wednesday became Gym Day.

In 1986 the old kitchen became our first kindergarten. In 1989, after extensive evaluation, St. Philip's was accredited by the Middle States Association. And with that major project completed, the last of the Bernardine Sisters left St.

Philip's. They had served us well for 29 years and with their leaving went many of our traditions.

We look forward to having our alumni join us in celebrating the school's 60th anniversary.
