From the desk of Fr. Lewis

First of all, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and for all in authority,

that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life.

In today's Second Reading, St. Paul's request for prayers for those in leadership is significant - but, I think, just as significant is his reason for these prayers: *that we might lead a quiet and tranquil life*.

At heart, each one of us has a longing for peace. September is the month for so many new beginnings - and we want to do things better, more thoughtfully, and more mindfully. If we prepare and plan prayerfully, we can make room for great peace.

PRAY: Discuss your plans with Almighty God. Open your ears for feedback. What is he inviting you to add to your life? What is he inviting you to cut from your life?

PROGRESS: The Lord often invites us to take small steps. This year, add one good thing. Take out one problematic thing. Ask the Lord's help to make the adjustments he inspires you to make.

PEACE: Enjoy the peace that grows in your soul when you respond "Yes" to the Lord's way. The rewards are not just in some distant future - they come in the present, as we become more deeply aware of the presence of Jesus in our souls and our ability to love.
