*From the desk of Fr. Lewis*

As we enter into Respect Life Month this October, I would like to honor a group of unsung heroes who quietly and heroically sacrifice to save lives. Each and every day, around the country, you will find brave men and women who stand outside abortion clinics praying and trying to bring aid to women in crisis pregnancies. They are called "sidewalk counselors," and they are the last person a woman might see before entering the place where unborn babies have their lives taken away.

Each of us has been affected by abortion. Whether we know it or not, there are people who would be in our lives but who are not because of abortion. Whether we know it or not, we have friends or family members who have been wounded by choosing abortion. Perhaps we have been involved in abortion ourselves and are still waiting the healing of the Lord's mercy. This month, all of our consciences should be pricked, "What did you do for the least of my people?"

The sidewalk counselor, through his or her prayer, seeks to offer peace in a place where evil is palpable. They are routinely vilified in the media. They are mocked by our culture. Through their witness and the support they offer, hearts have been changed and lives have been saved.

May this Respect Life Month be a time of healing and prayer. We honor those who are committed to fighting the evil of abortion. 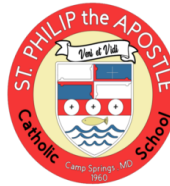

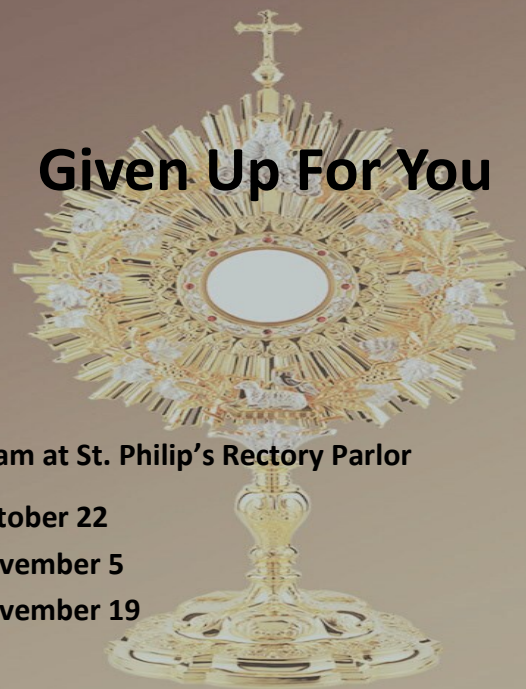
