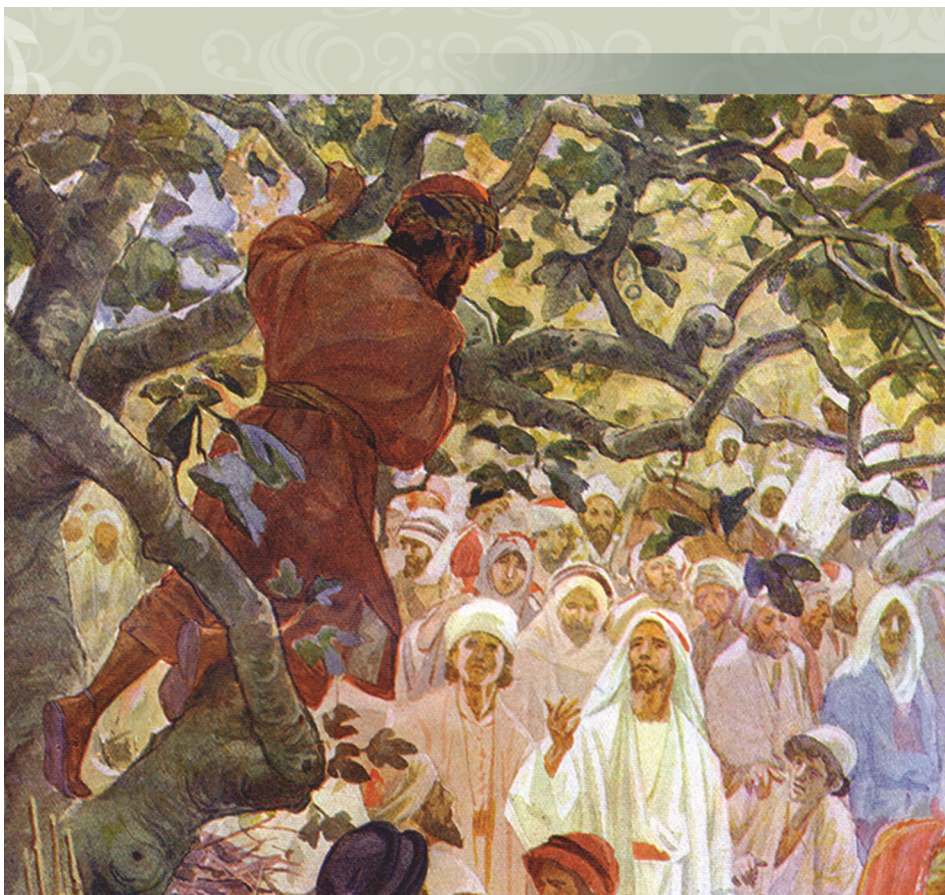

**A FAMILY PERSPECTIVE**

Jesus is saying to you what he said to Zacchaeus, "I must stay at your house today." It doesn't matter if in today's Gospel Jesus "intended to pass through Jericho to another town." In families we sometimes stop at the wrong places. It is wisdom to "pass through" annoying family situations so we can enjoy the goodness of each other. By Bud Ozar

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

"The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them." This is the opening line in the selected reading from the Book of Wisdom during our celebration of All Souls day. In our Catholic tradition we celebrate All Saints and All Souls day on November 1st and 2nd. During these two days we recognize the declared Saints in their magnificence and we celebrate All Souls when we hear about God's mercy.

These celebrations give us reassurance of God's good, honest, and loving nature especially when the souls that have gone before us are the souls of our own loved ones. Many people, after the death of a loved one, have questions about the status of their beloved. Is he/she at peace? What will happen to his/her soul? Where do you think he/she will go – to heaven with all saints, to purgatory with all souls, or...to hell with all those who have, by their own will, rejected God's love and mercy?

It is for that reason that we should spend a moment of reflection on how we perceive the hand of God if, indeed, the souls of the just are in the hand of God. Do we perceive the hand of God as warm and soft, inviting us to join with him in building the kingdom of faith? Or, do we perceive the hand of God as cold and hard, shunning us from embracing him?

We must have assurances of faith in perceiving the hand of God as compassionate and caring, but also as the hand of truth and justice. It is in the hand of God that the souls of our loved ones will be lifted up and embraced, but at the same time, those souls will be tried and purified.

We, as Catholic faithful, believe in the teachings of heaven, purgatory, and hell. These beliefs are the foundation of our liturgy during these days. Focusing on All Souls (November 2nd): it is during this particular day that we pray for All Souls (which are sometimes referred to as the "Poor Souls") – that they may be or may become the just souls that are in the hand of God. We pray for their constant care. We pray for their purification. And, we pray for their graduation to a closer unity with God in heaven.

It is our collective hope that this community of living believers and all souls that have gone before us experience the power of our prayers. It is in this common hope that we all appreciate the significance of this process of purification. And, it is in complete hope that we rejoice in God's ultimate desire to gather us all together again on that final day of judgment when all things come to a culmination.

We may think that the emphasis today is on all those who have died and have gone before us seeking the eternal peace of God, but the emphasis is also on us – the living ones. We gather together as a people of faith to give support to those who are still grieving the loss of their loved ones, we pray for those souls of the dead but we also pray for our own souls. We pray that one day we will all be caught up in the "communion of Saints" and held in the "hand of God." May God judge our souls to be among those that are just so that we may be led to the house of the Father where Jesus has prepared a place us.

Let us pray: Loving and Merciful God, we entrust our beloved deceased to your mercy. You loved them greatly in this life: now that they are freed from all its cares, give them happiness and peace forever. The old order has passed away: welcome them now into paradise where there will be no more sorrow, no more weeping or pain, but only peace and joy with Jesus, your Son, and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen

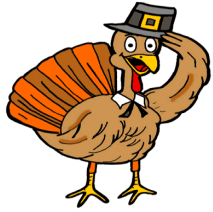

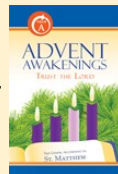

RESULTS: Synod of Bishops for Amazon

The three-week Synod of Bishops for the Amazon, which concluded last Sunday at the Vatican, was “the unequivocal commitment by the church in the nine countries of the Amazon region to seek new ways to preach the Gospel and to promote justice and stand in solidarity with its 34 million inhabitants, including some 2.5 million indigenous peoples in voluntary isolation, in defense of their rights to life, land and their cultures, and against all forms of violence and exploitation to which they are subject . . .”

The synod, attended by about 185 bishops and church leaders, “committed the church in the region to work for the protection of the Amazonian rainforest, often described as one of the lungs of the earth and of vital importance for humanity. It underlined the great risks to the whole world of the deforestation of Amazonia and reports that 17 percent of the forest has already been destroyed, a fact that threatens the entire ecosystem. But the final document says it is still possible to save the tropical forests and the ecosystem as well as the indigenous peoples . . .”
