



DEAR PARISHIONERS,

The scripture readings for this weekend and the next are about bringing healing to the wounded and hope to the weary. In the gospel Jesus heals Simon Peter's mother-in-law, and other various suffering and possessed people. In the first reading we hear of the weary and worn Job who expresses hopelessness and a life without happiness because of the sufferings he endures.

I always love to read about the healing powers of Jesus. There are so many healing stories and miracles Jesus did as He made the lame walk, the blind see, the deaf hear, the mute speak, the lepers clean, and the dead come to life. It amazes me how He did this by just His mere presence, the touch of His hand and sometimes without a word ever coming forth from His mouth.

Upon reflection of these healing miracles and through the study of sacred scripture, I have found the physical healing of these infirmities is not the main message but rather it is the restoration of hope that needs to be emphasized. Jesus himself understood people would label Him as a miracle healer without acknowledging the fact He had come not just as a healer but also as a harbinger of hope. This is why, again and again, Jesus demands those He has healed stay quiet about the matter. Jesus wants to be known in His fullness as God's hope filled presence among us rather than be used like some over the counter, quick relief remedy.

I am amazed at how many of us are attracted to the healing powers surrounding us today as we spend so much money and so much time with powerful drugs, special diets and specialized doctors. All of these are good things however, it causes me to question whether or not we are looking for physical healing or searching for eternal hope. I often wonder if we are turning to the good Lord at all and asking Him for direction. If Jesus Christ isn't part of our lives we may maintain physical health for awhile but attaining eternal hope is highly unlikely and eternal hope is the life goal of all believers.

Consider the scripture readings for this weekend. Job, who is in despair, laments to God. Job is without hope. He is restless and weary from his long misery. He is any one of us who questions whether or not we should continue onward in this life. Job provides us with no answer but directs us toward God. Job helps us, not just identifying with us in our miseries but also by assuring us these human reactions to sickness and suffering are normal. This is a message to us from God who, at times, can seem to be distant and silent - letting us know we are not alone. These moments lead us back to God through the help of others and the power of prayer.

The Gospel of Mark presents us with the completion of Jesus' first full day in ministry. After Simon Peter's mother-in-law, the whole town gathers around Him that evening with their sick and possessed. Jesus' first day of preaching and healing has given them hope, God is at work among them. Notice please, the important role of the disciples and townspeople who either brought Jesus to those suffering or brought those suffering to Jesus. Jesus' presence and power gave them all hope, God was at work among them.

Today, in this day and age, suffering still exists and despair still resides in the shadows of broken hearts and empty lives. Today there is still a need for hope. A hope God is at work among us. How do you think we experience God's healing presence in the Church and in the World? What do we, as disciples of Christ and citizens of the kingdom of God bring to those who suffer or bring the suffering to?

It must be our faith in Christ, the truth of His word and sacraments that represent His full presence and power among us, healing us and instilling hope within us. All of us who have been baptized are responsible in carrying out the mission of bringing others to healing and establishing hope for those who are weak in faith.





FOOD PANTRY






