**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

"Zeal for your house consumes me."

I think we all remember or at least are familiar with the syndicated TV show, "The Brady Bunch" and its memorable characters which included: Mike, Carol, Alice, Greg, Peter, Bobby, Marcia, Jan, and Cindy.

There was this particular episode (episode eight during season two) entitled, "Fist Full of Reasons." It aired on November 13, 1970. This particular episode had Cindy and Peter dealing with an unsavory character named Buddy.

If you recall Cindy, she is the youngest of the girls and the youngest in the family. She is sweet, kind, and beautiful in her own way. Buddy is the school bully and likes to pick on people. He has chosen Cindy because she speaks with a lisp. Peter becomes the epitome of being filled with "zeal" as he attempts to take the "middle ground" stepping in to defend Cindy because she, like anyone else, is worth defending.

This episode deals with the consternation of Peter who gets caught in the middle. He doesn't desire to fight but regardless of his hopes of being nonviolent he becomes engaged in confrontation, reasoning and defending. Unfortunately, in the end and with a twist of irony, Buddy gets punched by Peter, gets a chipped tooth and Buddy begins to speak with a lisp. The tables are turned and all the kids begin to laugh at Buddy. Peter, now aware of the tragedy of it all, rebukes them telling them to "Knock it off."

In some ways Cindy Brady could be likened to the Church as imperfect but, at the same time, sweet, kind and beautiful. She is worthy of being defended. Buddy the bully could be likened to the oppressive forces (physical or spiritual) that oppress the Church for no good reason. Peter Brady is "us" - we are in the middle - called to be filled with zeal - called to defend the Church and hopefully do so in a non-violent way.

If we are Peter Brady - are we filled with zeal for God's house? How do we stand ready to defend Holy Mother Church through the use of confrontation, reasoning and defending? Consider the outstanding members of the Church in the apostles, martyrs, saints and missionaries throughout the course of our Catholic history. Predominately nonviolent but incredibly steadfast in convictions toward Christ and His Church, they changed the hearts and minds of many. They "turned the tables."

As God gives the Ten Commandments to the people through Moses, Jesus gives His mandates to us through the Church. In the gospel, Jesus shows His zeal for the temple as he turns the tables. So, too, should we show our conviction for the Church by turning the tables on our culture which seems to consider our Christian faith and Catholic religion as irrelevant and out of touch.

We should strive to be the outstanding members of the Church today by giving bold witness to our faith which includes worship on Sundays. Coming to Church is essential. Becoming Church is just as crucial. But we cannot achieve one without the other. As this pandemic endures, even though we may see the light at the end of the tunnel, it becomes paramount that we consistently come to Church to receive Jesus through the sacraments. This holy connection will make us more strident in inviting and encouraging others to return to this place of worship. We need to especially be attentive to those who may have been gone for quite some time and perhaps have the mindset now that going to Mass virtually is just as good if they choose to be attentive to Church if at all.

We can't let that happen. We must turn the tables on this mindset. We must take the stance of Peter Brady or, even better, the strength of Jesus, and be filled with zeal for God's house, this house of prayer, reestablishing its rightful place in the hearts of all parishioners.

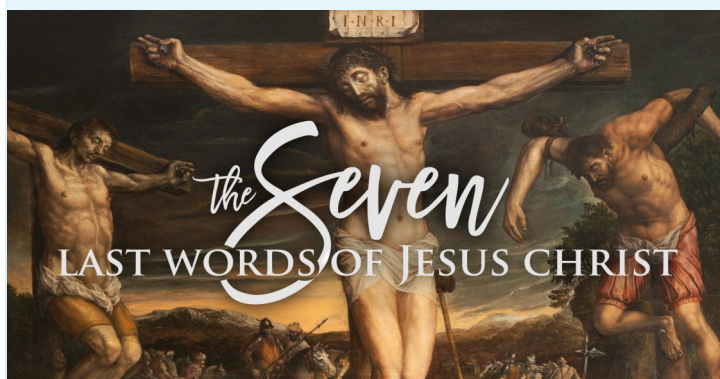
