

**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

“Who am I to have been chosen for this life?”

As I reflected on the scripture passages for this weekend, I wondered what the experience was like for Amos as the Lord took him from his familiar lifestyle and told him, “Go, prophesy to my people?” I wondered what the experience was like for the Apostles when Jesus summoned the Twelve from the crowd of many and sent them out to testify on his behalf?

Amos was taken and told by the Lord, God. The apostles were summoned and sent by the Lord, Jesus. And, I wonder if they had a question in their hearts as they took those steps toward transition? Was the question, “Who am I to have been chosen for this life?”

The readings have such a profound sense of mission attached to them as we read of Amos and how he was told to go and prophesy to God’s people and as we read of the Twelve and how they were sent out to proclaim the Kingdom of God.

It is ironic to note just how seemingly unrelated the prior occupations of these people were to the Mission that they have received. Amos was known by all and only saw himself as a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores but the Lord, God saw more. So therefore, Amos was called to be a prophet. The twelve were known by all and only saw themselves as individuals that held various occupations including but not limited to fishermen and a tax collector, but the Lord, Jesus saw more. So therefore, they were called to be his unique representatives to all the nations.

What was it that drew them to take on a new life? What was it that helped them further define who they truly were and what they were supposed to do in life? Obviously, it was the Lord that called them but it was also the Mission that they were sent to fulfill that began to clearly define their relationship with God and their place in this world.

Much like Amos and the Apostles, being taken and told, summoned and sent, we are called forth by God and we embark on a Mission that more clearly defines just who we are and what we are all about? As the second reading from Paul’s letter to the Ephesians implies, “God chose us in Christ, before the foundation of the world.” As we have been so chosen so we have been sent on a Mission. That Mission intermingles with us and we with it to bring its promised fulfillment to completion. This Mission and our participation in it help us to answer the question, “Who am I to have been chosen for this life?”

I took the liberty of reviewing our Mission Statement: “Be a Catholic Community that is a Visible Presence of Jesus.” Once in awhile it is good to review this mission statement as it applies to us as a community and as individual members of the parish. It is also a fitting source as we review of our own self-identity. Our Mission Statement helps to clarify and define just who we are.

We are the people who, much like Amos, have been taken from the ordinary and told to do the extraordinary. We are the people who, much like the apostles, have been summoned from among the many and sent forth to do something special. We are the people who, as St. Paul suggests, have been chosen by God in Christ before the foundation of the world to fulfill a unique mission.

“Who are we to have been chosen for this life?” Quite simply, we are the fortunate ones who have chosen to respond to God’s call to holiness and fullness of life as we are sent forth on a Mission. In summary, we are taken and told, summoned and sent, chosen before the foundation of the world, destined to be one with God through Christ. So, thank you for responding to your call. Thank you for cooperating in the Mission. Thank you for finding your fulfillment in life by serving Christ through the Church. Thank you for being a visible presence of Jesus.


Confirmation:

Eucharistic Adoration

There will be **no Eucharistic Adoration on Tuesdays, July 13 and July 18**, due to Totus Tuus and Vacation Bible School. These events will be using the church for their programs.

Can you help with the last 1%?

Thank you to all who have contributed to the Building A Visible Presence Capital Campaign to fund a new school building! Resurrection has now matched 99% of a \$2.5 million matching gift. An anonymous donor created a match so that for every dollar given to the campaign, one dollar is matched up to \$2.5 million. We are now only \$14,700 short of maximizing this match! (see chart below) If you have not yet returned your commitment card or are willing to increase your previous gift, please do so as soon as possible. You can also complete your pledge card online by going to <https://res-dbg.org/capital-campaign-update> Your contributions and/or pledges will double until we reach \$2.5 million.

Resurrection hopes to surpass the match and raise \$3.05 million in this campaign, which would cover our portion of the total. The remaining \$5.55 million is being funded by our anonymous donor and Holy Family Catholic Schools System. We are excited about the impact a new school building will provide students, teachers and our parish. Please continue to pray for God's guidance throughout this process as well as the campaign volunteers and entire Resurrection community.
