DEAR PARISHIONERS,

What are we celebrating when we gather together for Mass on this Holy Day of Obligation? What is our focus? What is the intention of this Solemnity? What is the Assumption?

The teaching of our Catholic faith states that through the doctrine of the Assumption, "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."

Being assumed signifies that Mary, a mere creature very much like us but *full* of grace, was taken up into heaven by divine power. Though not the same as the Ascension, which is by Jesus' own divine nature of being consubstantial with the Father, Mary's assumption is through her being *highly* favored. She being pure and lowly was, through the privilege of being chosen as the Mother of God, granted this divine favor and was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory without corruption or decay.

That is pretty much the "nuts and bolts" of the Assumption. It is a rather technical and an impersonal look at Mary. However, the focus, the intention, the reason we celebrate the Assumption is not to glorify the person of Mary (of course we honor her as the Mother of God) but rather it is to show us the hopes and goals that God, through Jesus, places within each one of us with Mary as our exemplar.

Being full of grace, Mary is the perfect example of what it means to be obedient to those hopes and goals of God. Mary's assumption into heaven is a sign to us of our destiny. She is what we would have been had we not been subjected to sin. She is the model of what we shall be as we strive to live grace filled lives. In a sense, Mary has established a pattern in which the Church will reach its perfection.

Mary was chosen by God yet she suffered and rejoiced. She was impregnated with the Word of God yet she suffered and rejoiced. She lived and died in imitation of and in participation with the death of her Son. She died as an act of self-giving. But, death could not hold her. She was raised to glory. She is, thus, the first of the redeemed to be raised providing a pathway for us.

Like Mary, as a perfect disciple, let us allow ourselves to be impregnated by the Word of God and let us give it life. As the gospel of Luke relates, "Blest are they who hear the word of God and keep it." Like Mary we too are asked to bear Christ to one another through our suffering and rejoicing. We are asked to live and die in Christ Jesus while participating in His mission in the world so that we might enjoy eternal glory with Him.

The feast of the Assumption is Mary's tie with us in our way through this life. She is the first fruits of what we too will receive through and from Jesus. She urges us not to abandon Him but cling to Him as we cry aloud in pain or perhaps waiver in our hope in the promises of Christ. Mary's assumption assures us of the "special place" prepared for us as it was already for her where we are reunited with Jesus and all of our loved ones.

Please reflect on the following words as they serve as a prayer within the context of the Holy Mass we offer on this solemnity: "For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church's coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people: rightly you would not allow her to see the corruption of the tomb since from her own body she marvelously brought forth your incarnate Son, the Author of Life."

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

WE MET OUR MATCH!

Thank you to all who have contributed to the Building A Visible Presence Capital Campaign to fund a new school building! An anonymous donor created a match so that for every dollar given to the campaign, one dollar is matched up to \$2.5 million. With some recent contributions, we have now met our match! We are so excited to reach this milestone and move on to the next step.

Resurrection hopes to raise an additional \$550,000 for this campaign, over and above the \$5 million that has already been committed. This would cover our portion of the building's total cost without reaching into cash reserves. As a reminder, Holy Family Catholic Schools System has committed \$3.05 million to this project as well.

Our Campaign Committee is currently working on reaching out to potential donors outside of Resurrection to continue getting closer to our goal, however, If you have not yet returned your commitment card or are willing to increase your previous gift, please do so as soon as possible.
