

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

The Household of God is a great image for us to focus upon as the gospel reading leads us into asking ourselves a very important question. If the Lord were to return to his own household - as the Master returns from a wedding to his own household - how would you like Jesus to find you? Would you like Jesus to find you and His household in a state of disarray, distraction, destruction - in a state of sin? Or, would you rather like Jesus to find you and his household in a state of expectancy, peace, purity - in a state of grace?

It seems quite obvious that we would prefer that Jesus, upon his return, find us in that state of grace and peace. However, it also seems obvious that a great majority of us choose to live in a destructive and distracted way. A good number choose to live in a state of sin with no concern regarding that impending return.

In a sense, Jesus' return can be likened to a parent's return to their own household after they have been out for a time. As parents are expected to return to their home and their children, God is to be expected in a similar way. As parents take leave of their own home they have expectations and responsibilities that they leave in the hands of those who remain. Some parents leave those expectations and responsibilities in the hands of their own children and some employ the services of others - namely, babysitters. In both situations and relationships there is the element of trust and faith.

I will use two analogies. The first reflects a bad situation and bad scenario. A few years ago, there was a Tombstone Pizza commercial. In the commercial the parents return home the next day from an overnight outing. They are confronted with the remnants of a very intense party that took place during their absence. Among the devastation they find their son who is passed out on the couch lying upside down with a sombrero tied to his head.

Absorbing all of this, the mother screams out her son's name. Dazed and confused the son comes to and stands before them caught in a state of guilt with a glazed over expression, the sombrero off kilter on his head. His father, seething with anger, looks at him and says, "What do you want on your tombstone?" It is from this point that the commercial goes into selling its product as the son requests certain toppings on his pizza rather than words on his grave marker.

Anybody up for a pizza?! All kidding aside, it's the image of once trusting parents now enraged as they return to a destroyed household that I want you to appreciate and apply in this scenario. Although it is not a very pleasant image of God, you may be able to understand it within this context.

The other analogy is reflective of a good situation and good scenario. Every parent has in mind the image of a perfect babysitter. They trust this person with their own children and their own household. When they are gone they have no concerns because everything has been left in competent and capable hands. When they return they find a household that is prepared and peaceful. The house is in order. The children are in bed sleeping soundly. The babysitter has been anticipating their return and the parents find her alone, alert and eager to bring them up to speed on all that has transpired in their absence.

The trusting parents are extremely pleased with the personality and performance of this particular babysitter. They reward her well and make all efforts in the future to utilize her services whenever they are in need. The image of these trusting parents returning to a peaceful home in gratitude for the services rendered is the other image I want you to appreciate and apply to God upon returning to us. It is a much better image to apply to God in this context, don't you think?

A few differences are apparent within these scenarios. We can envision the reactions of trusting parents to situations and circumstance that are either very disappointing or very pleasing. However, one difference that is not so obvious is the attitude that dwells within the guilty son or the ideal babysitter.

Perhaps the attitude of the guilty son is rooted in selfishness and carelessness which is disrespectful of his parents and undermines their authority. If his attitude could speak it would say, "This is my house; this is my life; these are my needs, my dreams and all that really matters is my image." Whereas the attitude of that ideal babysitter is rooted in stewardship and responsibility mindful of the needs of others as well as respectful of the authority of the parents. If her attitude could speak it would say, "This is their home which has been entrusted to me. These are their expectations and all that really matters is that I fulfill my role as caretaker and guardian to the best of my ability until they return."

Upon Jesus's return, it will not only be the activities but also the attitudes of the occupant within the household of God that will be considered. Interestingly, as we dwell here in the midst of God's creation, within a community of faith and as part of our own particular households we assume both roles of Sons and Daughters of God and Stewards (Ideal Babysitters) of God's household. This means that we are part of and responsible to the household of God. Therefore, our activities and attitudes must reflect those realities.

The challenge for us, as reflected in the gospel, is to prepare for the return of the Lord. That means changing our activities and attitudes by taking the focus off of ourselves and placing the emphasis on our role and place within the global and faith community by being totally present to each other and completely responsible members of the household of God. How would you like Jesus to find you upon his return among us? As it stands today, would He be pleased as punch or would He be prompted to say, "What do you want on your tombstone!"


Last Week to Register for Confirmation


