

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

Easter Blessings to all of you!

Up to this moment during this past Holy Week we have recalled the story of the last days of our Lord, Jesus Christ. On Palm Sunday we read of the Lord's Passion account regarding his triumphal entry into Jerusalem and this his painful persecution. During those subsequent days, including Holy Thursday, we read accounts of his celebration of Passover with the disciples; the institution of the Holy Eucharist as well as the ministerial priesthood and we remember the example of the washing of the feet.

Within those accounts we were made keenly aware that he was destined, by the Old Testament prophets, to be the one who was the suffering servant among us. On Good Friday, again we were reminded of his anguish and agony in the garden; his betrayal; his denial; his scourging; his sentencing; his way of the cross; his crucifixion; his feelings of abandonment; his death on the cross and finally his enclosure in the tomb.

All along this pathway toward his death, as we read these passion narratives, questions arise in the hearts and minds of the faithful today here and now. These are the same questions that arise from the crowds gathered around him at the scene of the actual crucifixion. "If he saved others why can he not save himself if he is the Son of God?" In other words, why could he not have called down the angels of God to stop this whole thing from happening? As he walked through those who wanted to stone him earlier in his ministry, why could he not have walked away from this awful event? Was he not aware of the fact that all of his words and actions would eventually lead him to his demise, his death and burial in a dark tomb? Did he not know that he was digging himself deeper and deeper into a hole, so to speak? And if so, why did he not follow the old adage, "If you find yourself in a hole, stop digging?"

We know for a fact that Jesus did, indeed, know that his path was leading to his death. During his final road trip to Jerusalem he mentions it time and time again to his disciples. Jesus explicitly tells them as least a dozen times within the four gospel accounts that he will be put to death somehow. However, with each of these proclamations just a few words later, he also tells them that he will be lifted up again.

So, yes, Jesus did know quite clearly that his journey would lead to his death. He knew that he was digging himself into a hole. But, don't forget that he was also building a kingdom to be given to faithful people who would continue his mission. Jesus kept digging despite the awareness of his impending suffering and death because he was certain of his resurrection.

He knew, through his intimacy with the Father and with the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, that the hole he dug for himself (the tomb in which he would be laid) was not the end but rather, the beginning of the foundation upon which the church would be built with himself as the cornerstone. He was, is and will forever be the beginning and the end (the Alpha and the Omega) of his kingdom. It is his kingdom that is being built, the size and scope of which is yet to be determined. It continues to be built on us and our participation in it. Its success depends upon our generosity and commitment to shoulder the load with his grace.

Have you permitted the Easter experience to influence the direction and efforts of your lives? Giving witness to your faith in the resurrection places you deeper and deeper into conflict with how the world thinks and operates. It also forces you to trust in God. Do you keep digging with confidence and


Baptism Preparation Class
