

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

This weekend is dedicated to two thematic realities that seem very pertinent to the Catholic Church as a whole and to you in specific. One of the themes we focus on this weekend is Good Shepherd Sunday. The other theme is World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

The opening prayer, the responsorial psalm, the second reading from the first letter of Peter and the Gospel all speak of the theme of shepherding. Particularly, in the Gospel from John, it is Jesus who speaks of himself as the shepherd - the gatekeeper. As I read and reflected on this gospel in preparation for writing this, I was profoundly moved by the following words from within this gospel passage, "...the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers."

"But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." That last line is really apropos for us at this juncture in our Catholic Church and for you at this time within this faith community. On April 4, just over three weeks ago Archbishop Jackels, the voice of the Shepherd in this archdiocese had resigned for health reasons and left for retirement in California.

For ten years he has led us by the Word and fed us at the table with the Eucharist. He was prolific in his teaching, preaching, writing and reuniting. As he presided at countless Confirmation ceremonies and years of Ordination events as well as providing weekend coverage for priests that needed a break, we not only grew accustomed to his voice but we also adored him, loved him and will miss him dearly.

Sometime soon, God willing, we will have a new archbishop. This will be a new voice for us to hear. Seemingly, a stranger will become our shepherd. What will we do? What will you do? Will you run away or will you stay?

Speculation, suspicion arise in our hearts and minds as to who this next archbishop will be. Perhaps its part of our human nature to wonder and worry about who will fill this vacancy. I am sure that some of us have let our thoughts be known on who we would like to see as the new Shepherd.

Perhaps the voice will have a change in tone, a slightly different inflection, a bit of an accent and a new cadence to it but it is still the voice of the shepherd. And, like it or not we must listen to it and follow it regardless of our grieving over the loss of familiarity and comfort with the old voice to which we have grown accustomed.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, we remember the words from the Gospel of Mark (6:34) when Jesus saw the vast crowds gathered around. He took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd. We are not meant to be without Shepherds. We need them. We will always need them. So, let us pray for them.

Consider offering this prayer for a new bishop that was used in 2018 for the Diocese of Sioux Falls, South Dakota. I adapted it for our use.


