

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

"Consecrated in the Truth"

Being a teenager and getting a tattoo seems to go hand and hand these days. So, one adult wasn't surprised when one of her daughter's friends showed her a delicate little Japanese symbol on her hip. "Please don't tell my parents," she begged. "I won't," promised the adult. "You're 18 now, so I guess it's your choice. By the way, what does that little Japanese symbol stand for?" To which the young girl sheepishly replied, "Honesty."

In the gospel selection from John, chapter 17:11-19, we hear Jesus pray to the Father not only for the unity of the disciples (so that they may be one just as He and the Father are one) and, not only, that they be kept safe from the "Evil One" but also that they may be "consecrated in the truth." What does that mean, "Consecrated in the Truth?"

The biblical interpretation of the word "consecrate" is defined as "to take out the sphere of the profane and place in the sphere of the divine." This means an emptying of self from worldly ways and a total dedication to the ways of God. This means being set apart for a special task. This also means having special qualities of heart and mind and character for that special task. In the Catholic world we have both men and women who profess final vows and are consecrated or ordained into a life of religious service. There is an ontological change - a transformation of being - that happens within that person.

In the gospel, before He ascends to Heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father, Jesus prays that this "consecration" may happen to his disciples so that they may be conformed to the ways of God revealed through Jesus Christ and that they be dedicated to his service. Precisely because the consecration of the disciples is for the service of God in the discipleship of Jesus, they are then sent out into the world just as Jesus was sent by the Father.

The parallelism between His sending and theirs is to be observed. Jesus is the one uniquely consecrated by the Father and sent by Him into the world to bring to the world the revelation of the fullness of Father and his saving grace. Jesus' entire ministry was a fulfillment of that calling and now Jesus stands in the hour of final accomplishment before His Ascension. Jesus now hands over the mission to his disciples he has prepared for this task.

Regarding our relationship with the Risen Jesus through baptism, I think we short change ourselves in recognizing and then realizing the depth of our calling to be his disciples. No doubt, Jesus continues to pray for us as he did his own disciples. He sits at the right hand of the Father to intercede for us praying that we too be united and kept safe from the "Evil One" but that we also be "consecrated in the truth" emptied of pursuing worldly allurements and filled with divine light in order to serve Him. Only if and when we live in His truth and proclaim it to others may His joy be ours and our joy be complete.

Soon enough there will be commencement ceremonies taking place in high school auditoriums and on college campuses throughout this great nation. As graduates depart from these institutions of higher learning and are sent out into the world perhaps we can make Jesus' prayer for his disciples our prayer for them. Let us pray that they may be more closely united together in the mission of Jesus Christ through His Church, kept safe from the Evil One and, most especially, consecrated in the truth.

Being so, is more precious than a forgotten diploma on a wall or, even for that matter, a Japanese symbol tattooed on hidden hip. Being consecrated is transformative. It calls us to testify to the truth, to give witness to Jesus Christ in every way so that His joy may be in us and our joy may be complete.


Father's Day Spiritual Bouquet
