DEAR PARISHIONERS,

Happy Pentecost!

What am I?

I possess over 100 trillion cells.

I have 206 bones that make up my skeleton.

Over 600 muscles help me to survive and thrive.

I have 22 internal organs.

There are 11 separate systems that function within me with incredible coordination.

If you were to stretch out my innards (intestines) they would measure close to 28 feet.

If you were to take all my blood vessels (veins, arteries and capillaries) and connect them end to end they would stretch out to be 100,000 miles which is the distance equivalent to traveling 4 times around the equator of the earth.

What am I? The Human Body.

Consider the human body in all its complexities. What a great machine with its diversity and interdependence. Who can question the existence of God when we consider our human body? What a great gift that we have that we often take for granted!

Taking care of the body is an important job. Eat right, exercise, sleep enough, avoid excessive stress and see a doctor for a periodic physical and perhaps an annual physical especially if you are advancing in age.

In a survey published in the Archives of Internal Medicine, researchers reported that 65 percent of nearly 800 primary care physicians from Boston, Denver, and San Diego believed an annual physical to be a necessity, 74 percent felt that it improved early detection of illness, and 94 percent said it improved patient-physician relationship.

Seeing the doctor is important even for young healthy people, since doing so can help physicians catch difficult to spot problems associated with communicable diseases, mental health and substance abuse.

When our birthdays add up our physical bodies and their functionality have a tendency to decline. A physical exam, evaluation or assessment becomes more of a necessity in order for us to enjoy longevity.

Part of the evaluation, now more than ever before, includes not just physical but also mental assessment as it is more holistic including body, mind and spirit. Asking subtle questions and taking cues from appearances and responses, the doctor takes a look at the whole package and then offers advise on changes, adjustments or treatments.

In the second reading for this weekend St. Paul is like a good physician as he takes a look at the total package in the early church at Corinth. They have different spiritual gifts but the same spirit. They are one body though many parts but are still of one spirit.

There have been many anniversaries of Pentecost (Birthdays of the Church) since the beginning of the Church. As a body (the body of Christ) it is good to have periodic physical examinations that include the total package (body, mind and spirit).




End Poverty Through Systemic Change


Father's Day Spiritual Bouquet
