

57th Annual Resurrection Festival Sunday, August 20, 2023



DEAR PARISHIONERS,

Ole and Lena were at a church meeting one night. Low and behold, an angel suddenly appears in the midst of this meeting and, in front of all who are present, tells Ole that in return for his unselfish and exemplary behavior, God will reward him with his choice of infinite wealth, wisdom, or beauty. Without hesitating but a bit under pressure, Ole selects infinite wisdom. "Done!" says the angel, and disappears in a cloud of smoke and a bolt of lightning.

Now, all heads turn toward Ole, who sits surrounded by a faint halo of light. Recently having been given this divine insight and deep understanding, Ole has this look of certainty but also chagrin on his face. Lena whispers to him, "Say something!" Ole sighs, shakes his head and says, "I now understand that... I should have taken the money."

How well can we relate to that response? How much different are we really than Ole? If we discovered the proverbial "genie in a bottle", or encountered and angel as did Ole, or experienced God in a dream as did Solomon, in our first reading today, which one of those three options would you choose? Really?

Infinite wisdom or the "Gift of Understanding" doesn't seem to be all that marketable or meaningful in this day and age. Beauty and Wealth seem to capture our hearts and imaginations more than anything else. However, it was Solomon's request for an understanding heart that obviously captured the attention of God as the first reading said, "The Lord was pleased that Solomon made this request. So, God said to him: 'Because you have asked for this - not for a long life for yourself, nor for riches, nor for the life of your enemies, but for UNDERSTANDING so that you may know what is right - I do as you requested. I give you a heart so wise and understanding that there has never been anyone like you up to now, and after you there will come no one equal to you."

Solomon's request for "understanding" captures God almost as if God was off guard, not expecting that sort of request. And God responds. God is pleased and is filled with delight for Solomon because Solomon is not thinking as human beings do but as God does. We might remember Peter the Apostle identifying Jesus as the "Anointed One of God" but then remonstrating or rebuking Jesus when Jesus told the disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and be crucified. Remember how displeased and disappointed Jesus was when he told Peter, "Get behind me Satan, for you are not thinking as God does but as human beings do!"

Our challenge today is to capture God's attention and that is not by wishing for material wealth or asking for fleeting beauty. It is really about our heart's longing to become more Godly in and with all things. It is really about praying for an "understanding heart." When was the last time we honestly made this request of God? Let's make this request part of our daily prayer. Let's capture God and the heart of Jesus and be pleasing and delightful to Him. God's desire is that we be one with Him and ultimately return to Him. Hopefully that is our desire as well.

Ole, Lena and Sven were lost in the woods of Northern Minnesota and were becoming desperate, having run out of food several days ago. It was winter, the snow was deep, their situation was looking very bleak. When Ole dug down into the snow to look for nuts, he found an oil lamp and upon rubbing it to get the snow off, a genie came out. The genie says, "I am da great genie of Nordern Minnesooota and I can grant each of you vun vish." Ole says, "I vish I vas back on da farm." Poof! Ole was gone. At other times, we are distracted or preoccupied by the cares of the world. But Christ always invites us to enter into song, to rise above our own preoccupations, and to give our entire selves to the hymn of his Paschal Sacrifice for the honor and glory of the Most Blessed Trinity."




