Susan B. Anthony was a prominent woman in American history playing a pivotal role in the 19th century women's rights movement. She was an important advocate in leading the way for women's rights to be acknowledged and instituted in American government. She has a side profile on the dollar coin. She is a symbol of audacity. But, we have greater than a Susan B. Anthony here in the gospel.

Rosa Parks was involved in a conflict on December 1, 1955 in Montgomery, Alabama. Rosa Parks, then age 42 years old, refused to obey the bus driver's orders that she give up her seat to make room for a white passenger. Her actions sparked the Montgomery Bus Boycott and became an important symbol of the Civil Rights movement. She is a symbol of Tenacity. However, we have greater than a Rosa Parks here in the gospel.

Peg Mullen from LaPorte City, IA became an anti-war activist after the death of her son in Vietnam who had been killed by shrapnel fired from friendly artillery in a 1970 incident. She became a fierce opponent of the US involvement in the Vietnam War and actively protested against other wars. Her life story was made into the Emmy Award winning 1979 film entitled, "Friendly Fire" starring Carol Burnett.

In 1998 she was inducted into the Iowa Women's Hall of Fame. At the age of 90 she received the Feisty Woman Award from the Iowa Women's International League for Peace and Freedom. She died two years later at the age of 92. She was the epitome of Feisty. Yet, we have a great than Peg Mullen here in the gospel.

The Canaanite Women is a fascinating personality. She is a woman in a male dominated society. She is a foreigner who ventures alone into an exclusive Jewish group. Upon finding a seemingly detached and distant Jesus, she refuses to give up. She is daring. She has all of the audacity of Susan B. Anthony; all of the tenacity of Rosa Parks; and all of the Feistiness of Peg Mullen.

Upon consideration of the Canaanite Woman in the gospel and the lives of the other women I mentioned, it is important to recognize and appreciate **not so much what they want or take from the table but rather what they make manifest or bring forth to the table.** Jesus recognizes and appreciates and rewards her bold persistency and her great faith. She brings it to the table.

Anjelica Huston, an actress and producer, is known not only for her accomplishments but also her relationships. She is the daughter of the late John Huston, a famous film director. She was also a former long-time girlfriend to Jack Nicholson. She has this quote that I believe speaks so well of the Canaanite Woman and how we should be influenced by her example in regards to our relationship with Christ and his Church. Her quote is, **"I've always thought with relationships, that it's more about what you bring to the table than what you're going to get from it. It's very nice if you sit down and the cake appears. But if you go to the table expecting cake, then it's not so good."**

Jesus recognized, appreciated and rewarded her by what the Canaanite Woman brought to the table in and through her daring audacity, tenacity and feistiness. What do we bring to the table in our relationship with Jesus Christ through the Church? What do we bring to the altar every Sunday? How well do we offer our time, talent and treasure?

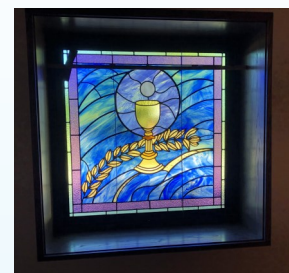
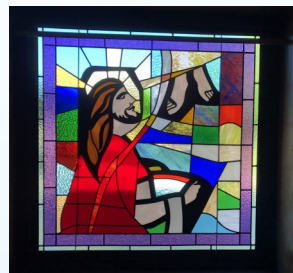

Finding creative ways to react and respond can make a big difference in the quality of their lives and enhance on-going relationships.

Providing state-of-the-art information grounded in Alzheimer's science, and teaching unique techniques drawn from spiritual practices and creative drama, this inspiring caregiver resilience workshop helps participants to:

- Expand their understanding of dementia
- Be present in the moment
- Accept what is
- Meet persons with dementia in their reality
- Let go of the need to control
- Find meaning and healing as a caregiver

Jade's most important and fruitful ministry, to date, has been caring for her mother, Jeanne, who died from Alzheimer's in 2011.
