

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

In August of 2010 the Subaru Car company put out an ad on TV called "Baby Driver" featuring a father handing over the car keys to his daughter as she sets off to drive alone for the first time. The ads starts with a 6-year-old girl behind the wheel of a Subaru Legacy, while her father gives her the "safety talk" through the passenger side window. When he passes her the keys we see that it has really been his 16-year-old daughter that about to take her first drive alone even though her Dad still sees her as his little baby girl.

In January 2011 — American Family Insurance Company produced a Teen Driver Commercial. In this commercial it is a teenage boy who is about to receive the car keys from his father. At that very same moment, the father is having flash backs to this same son who, in earlier years, is intentionally crashing his Big Wheel into the garage door with delight; running his skateboard into the curb and tumbling in the grass; jumping his bicycle over a ramp and wiping out; and finally, destroying cars as he is playing a video game of race cars.

We have Subaru featuring the safety of the car and we have American Family Insurance offering us a Comprehensive Plan. In each ad we have the father handing on the keys to the next generation while having thoughts of times past. Both fathers show an extreme amount of apprehension and anxiety on their faces.

In the gospel we see Jesus entrusting the keys of the kingdom of heaven into the hands of Peter. While Jesus does that he is not having thoughts of the past but rather exciting visions and hopes for the future. However, it is just a few lines later in that same gospel reading that Peter seems to dash the hopes of Jesus as Peter begins to think not as God does but as human beings do.

Peter is not the anointed one but he is the appointed one. So, that reality moves us to pray for the Pope as we should also pray for the Archbishop Elect, pray for your pastor, pray for yourselves as parents.

We may not have been entrusted with the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven but we have been entrusted with the responsibilities of Discipleship being in the driver's seat behind the wheel. We need God the Father's grace in order to think like God does and not as human beings do. It is better for us to envision God's face being filled with exciting visions and hopes for the future rather than being like that of the two fathers in the commercial ads being filled with apprehension and anxiety.
