During a baseball game, on June 2, 2010, between the Detroit Tigers and the Cleveland Indians the official on first base by the name of Jim Joyce made a "botched call" that cost the Detroit pitcher Armando Galarraga a perfect game, which would have been his first perfect game and, in reality, only the 21st perfect game in baseball history.

Through instant replay and still on You-Tube today, we see that it was a bad call which has been replayed over and over again for the entire world to see. However, the decision was never overturned by the baseball commissioner or the Major League Baseball franchise.

That following day, after blowing the call that prevented a "perfect game," right before the beginning of the next game of the series both the official, Jim Joyce, and the Detroit pitcher, Armando Galarraga, put on a display of perfect sportsmanship.

Joyce, whose face was red with emotion and fighting back tears, met Galarraga on the pitchers mound for a moment of reconciliation. Galarraga, who accepted the apology, said that he wasn't sore about the call. "You just move on, it's already happened," he said, "In my mind and heart and everybody I know, all you guys see I threw a perfect game."

In the scriptures for the weekend we are confronted with the reality of bad calls or good calls; what is within bounds or what is stepping over the line; what is foul and what is fair. And, whether or not we get caught up in the notion of instant replay - replaying the situation or issues over and over again without a desire to move on?

In the first reading from the prophet Ezekiel we hear the words, "You say, 'The Lord's way is not fair!'" Hear now, house of Israel: Is it my way that is unfair, or rather, are not your ways unfair?" Through the prophet Ezekiel we hear the Lord asking if we truly think God's ways are unfair or if our ways are unfair. This may be a difficult question for us. However, if we believe that it is God who makes up the rules of the game, the more difficult question may be "Who makes the call?" Who are the officials and who are the players? Are they bad calls or good calls?

It is then that we need to listen to Paul speaking to his beloved community of the Philippians. He asks that they all have the same love, the same thoughts, and the same desires. He goes further to spell out a formula for the Philippians and for us today, "Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus." This means that our actions, thoughts, judgments, feelings should be the same as those of Jesus.

Paul goes on to tell us that Jesus emptied himself taking the form of a slave; he humbled himself; he became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. In other words, Jesus emptied himself, humbled himself and became obedient to the ways of God that are, indeed good, right and just. Because of this God greatly exalted him.

Could you do this? Could I do this? Could we even do this together? Could we empty ourselves, humble ourselves and even become obedient to the point of death for God's ways? Jesus did it. We should not only admire this way "The Lord's Way" but we should also follow this "way." The way of Jesus is our way, the way to the Father.

October 4th is the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. This weekend we remember him as we sing "All Creatures of our God and King." This hymn which celebrates God's gifts of nature is based on St. Francis' poem "Cantic of the Sun" written in 1225 inspired by Psalm 148. We also remember St. Francis as we sing "Make Me A Channel of your Peace," which was written by Sebastian Temple, one of the great folk Mass composers from the era immediately following The Second Vatican Council. He grew up in South Africa, and eventually moved to America in the 1950s where he converted to Catholicism and joined the Franciscan Third Order. His first collection of liturgical music, *Happy the Man*, was all songs about St. Francis.

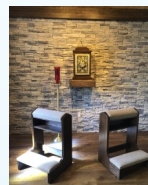

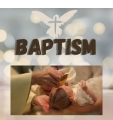

If we return to our first reading we are reminded that with God we can always turn back from our sinfulness, from our mistakes and misgivings; from our blunders and "bad calls." If we ask, we will always be forgiven, no matter what we have done. This is true for us but also for those we want to judge harshly, for those whom we think make bad choices or bad calls against us.

God is merciful! Amazingly, shockingly, and kindly God is merciful to everyone – even when we are not. "Remember your mercies, O Lord," and help us to be as merciful, as forgiving, as loving!"

We are all in this together and God is at our side inviting us to believe in His way; to follow His way; to play the game His way. Instead of getting caught up in playing a "perfect game" and get sidetracked by what we perceive to be a bad call perhaps, as the scriptures imply, we should aspire more towards perfect sportsmanship where we all need to meet on the mound for moments of reconciliation and then move on.
