

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

"Then repay Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." Let us allow those words to echo in our minds, resound in our hearts and settle in our souls.

In an era when the economy seems to continuously be in flux and the threat of increased taxation appears to be looming over us and breathing down our necks it is quite easy for us to complain about the government and criticize our politicians when we think about repaying Caesar. If we look at the world through the lenses of material well being we would see that we have the ugly creature of taxation lurking all around us in the form of sales tax; property tax; income tax; inheritance tax; and so on and so forth. We get all worked up and just wonder "what's next outside of our first-born child?!"

Whereas, if we look at the world through the lenses of faith, instead of wondering what belongs to Caesar, we should ask, "What belongs to God?" What do we have that God wants? What do we have that God desires? Quite simply God wants our hearts. God desires that our hearts be dedicated to him alone. Until that happens we will not have rest, peace, comfort, joy or hope no matter how much or how little we repay Caesar.

All things in this life are transitory, among them are: material wealth, physical health and power. Only one thing is eternal and that is our faith in God. If we follow the greatest commandment that we will hear about in next Sunday's gospel, if we invest all our heart, mind, soul and strength in loving God and our neighbor as ourselves we have nothing to fear. There awaits our consolation. "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

Giving to God what belongs to God is a way of life; an attitude and a commandment that makes itself manifest to the whole world through the form of both public worship and community service. One of the greatest things we can give to God is our presence in the world and our praise in church. Being there for God's sake and offering up our prayers of praise, blessings, adoration and glory is one of the best sacrificial offerings we can make. In today's Psalm 96 the refrain states, "Give the Lord Glory and Honor." So then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.

Last weekend I began to offer some reflections about our Mass—the celebration of the Eucharist. I offered you words of encouragement as to how we might better prepare ourselves for coming to this great banquet in terms of our etiquette and attire. Do we pray and fast before we get here? Do we allow ourselves enough time to arrive so as not to be rushed and stay until properly dismissed? Do we dispose of our chewing gum, shut off our cell phones and dress appropriately for the occasion? Do we offer the right gestures of reverence at the correct times during Mass (bowing during the Profession of Faith and before receiving communion)?

The Mass configures us and sends us forth as though on a mission, which is really where we get the name "Mass." We can't help but to know and understand that what we do in our worship leads into and strengthens how we live our lives as we leave; what happens during the course of the week is very much related to what we do when we gather to celebrate the Eucharist on Sunday.

There is a link as the Eucharist strengthens us for the mission of the Christian life and we bring back to the Eucharist all of the things we encounter in living the Christian life. We bring those imperfections, those weaknesses; those things that are yet incomplete and offer them to the Lord and implore his Continued on page 6.


