Have you ever played the game, Truth or Dare? You remember that game? I remember that game quite well as I, in my youth, I played it with the other kids as we rode along in the back of the school bus. And, I remember being so good at it because we were forbidden to lie...I was a terrible liar anyway. You see, Truth or Dare is a loaded game. Truth or Dare is considered an opportunity to reveal some deep inner truths and dares us to do things that we might consider extreme.

And so, I would like to play Truth or Dare with you. I would like to do this in the context of the readings for this weekend which are also obviously loaded with some harsh truths about priesthood and religious life and also some dares that we are to face as priests, religious and lay people.

The scriptures are loaded as we hear the reading from the prophet Malachi who looks harshly upon priests who have misdirected those whom they have been in charge and have fallen from the goodness of their office. "I will send a curse upon you and of your blessing I will make a curse. You have turned aside from the way, and have caused many to falter by your instruction; you have made void the covenant of Levi, says the Lord of hosts. I, therefore, have made you contemptible and base before all people, since you do not keep my ways, but show partiality in your decisions." WOW!

The gospel of Matthew presents to us a Jesus who harshly criticizes the scribes and Pharisees (the faith leaders of the communities) because of their hypocrisies as Jesus says, "Observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their examples." WOW.... And again, in the gospel Jesus severely scolds these leaders because of their self-righteousness, indifference, shallowness and conceit. Jesus teaches us that no one is above another, that no title (Father, Teacher, Master) gives us exultation above another; that the greatest will be the one who serves the rest. WOW!

Truth or Dare:

Truth - Is it true that in your past or perhaps in your present, you have experienced a priest or religious that has, through the abuse of their office, misguided you; harmed you; or hurt you? Have they brought offense against you or your family?

But, I Dare You - I dare you to have the strength and ability to look beyond these few incidents. The first reading from Malachi was written from a positive perspective. In order to criticize the bad ones Malachi knew of and admired the good ones, the good priests of the Levite order. He knew of good priests who communicated the mind and will of God to the people.

This is to say to us that for the few priests or religious that have brought us offense, there are myriad upon myriad of good priests and religious that are committed to their celibate lifestyles, their call to service of God's people and their communion with you. For us, one bad apple does not ruin the bunch regardless of what the media portrays; regardless of popular opinion. I dare you to let go of those past hurts. I dare you to forgive us when our human weakness gets in the way. I dare you to love us and let us into your lives.

Truth or Dare:

Truth: Is it true that we need more good men and women to assist us as our spiritual leaders on our life's journey to the Lord? Do we need more men and women to be holy priests and religious who take seriously the call of service to God's word? Are we receptive to religious vocations in our homes, parishes and in public? St. Paul, in his very passionate letter to the Thessalonians gives them thanks for being so



In the midst of that loving community, he experienced a sense of God as he wrote to them, "And for this reason we too give thanks to God unceasingly, that in receiving the word of God from hearing us, you received not a human word but, as it truly is, the word of God, which is now at work in you who believe."

That is to say to us that we need priests and religious - proclaimers of the word of God; the bearers of God's truth; and servants of God's people to lead us to a deeper conviction of faith and commitment to the will of God.

Then, I Dare You - I dare you to pray for and promote religious vocations wherever you go. Invite likely and suitable candidates to consider the priesthood or religious life, those who are capable and competent. Encourage your own children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins and friends to really reflect on that possibility for their future.

The truth is, God is calling all of us to either promote or consider a good, healthy and holy life not only as a layperson in the Church but also perhaps as a priest or religious. The dare is to commit ourselves to that end. Again, Truth or Dare is a loaded game, but then again such is life in the context of our faith. It is considered an opportunity to reveal some deep inner truths and it dares us to do things that we might consider extreme.



STO TAX CREDIT

The 75% Tax Credit sounds too good to be true, but it's not. If you file an lowa income tax return, your contributions to the Our Faith School Tuition Organization (STO) receive a 75% tax credit. For example, if you expect to owe \$1500 in lowa income tax, you can donate \$2000 to the STO and receive a \$1500 tax credit (\$2000 x 75%); this leaves you owing \$0 dollars on your lowa income taxes. In addition, your gift may qualify for federal deductibility. But let's not forget that the \$2000 you've given will provide tuition assistance for qualifying families in the Archdiocese. It is that simple. The STO is good for families, and good for you!
