

It seems to happen every year about this time. When I think ahead to Christmas I always begin to wonder not so much about what I am going to get for Christmas gifts but rather what I am going to give as Christmas gifts to those people who are special in my life.

I am continuously perplexed by those of my loved ones who are especially difficult to buy for during this season because I never know what they desire even though I ask them a number of times. Some people can be the hardest person to whom to offer a gift. I think it is because they are not forthcoming about what they would desire. I also believe that it is difficult because they seem to be people who think they already have everything they want or need. And, as the saying goes, "What do you give a person who already seems to have everything?"

Recently I went on line and I discovered that there is an organization entitled amazingclubs.com that help to match people's desires with a unique club wherein the members receive, on a monthly basis, a particular food, beverage or item to enjoy. A membership to this club is truly a gift that keeps on giving. This organization features 30 different clubs and of them they highlight the top 5 which are as follows: Wine club; Beer club; Coffee club; Fruit club and a Hot Sauce club. To say the least, it is an interesting organization to plug into and explore. It also does qualify as a potential gift item to get for those who seem to have everything.

In the second reading for this weekend, the first weekend of Advent, we read of St. Paul as he addresses the Corinthians. And, it appears as though St. Paul is in a predicament with this particular community because they seem to think that they have it all. In Paul's words, "...in him you were enriched in every way, with all discourse and all knowledge, as the testimony to Christ was confirmed among you, so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gifts as you wait for the revelation of our Lord, Jesus Christ." In other words, perhaps Paul is thinking to himself, "What do you give to those who already seem to have everything?"

This Sunday, like all of Advent, speaks the language of hope. For the people of Corinth years ago and for us as people of faith today, it is "hope" that qualifies as the gift that keeps on giving. "Hope" and more specifically, "Waiting in Hope" is the message that St. Paul preaches to the Corinthians as they are encouraged to stay firm to the end and irreproachable on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.

"Waiting in Hope" is also a major theme of today's gospel as we are summoned to "Be watchful! Be alert! It is not as though we should stand idle and wring our hands in despair nor is it an invitation of passive participation when we stop and do nothing at all.

"Waiting in Hope" suggests that we joyfully do the work entrusted to us as disciples of Jesus and look forward with enthusiasm to the future that is yet to come. The servants whom the master put in charge of his house waited by doing the work entrusted to them. Yet they cherished an excitement about the future; they were ready to hand over the best to the next generation. The Lord will surely come and he must come if God is to remain just. The

As we begin this Advent Season, we prepare the way of the coming of Jesus into our hearts and into our world. This year we introduce a new version of a very old hymn: Creator of the Stars at Night is a translation of the anonymous 7th century Latin hymn, Conditor alme siderum. It was translated into English by the Anglican priest, scholar and hymn-writer: John Mason Neale (1818-1866). In the Liturgy of the Hours, Creator of the Stars at Night is used during Advent. We will be using a new adaptation of this plainsong chant by Josh Blakesley, which has a simple refrain, "Come, O Come into the night, O Child of Light," And we will sing it at Communion throughout the Advent Season. Here are verses 1-2:

Creator of the stars of night, your people's everlasting light,
O Christ, Redeemer of us all, we pray you hear us when we call.
In sorrow that the ancient curse should doom to death a universe,
You came, O Savior to set free your own in glorious liberty.

Did you realize that this year, the Advent Season is actually only 3 weeks and 1 day long? The Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on December 24th, Christmas Eve, so it is the shortest Advent season. On the Fourth Sunday of Advent we will only have 2 morning



Masses at 8:00 and 10:00 am, because we will have 2 Christmas Eve Masses at 4:00 and 9:00! It will be a busy day at Church, especially setting up all the Christmas decorations, creche, flowers etc. between Masses. So let us prepare quickly for Jesus' coming this year!

promises have been made, and as the word of God they cannot be revoked. And, so we wait – not in fear but in hope.

This Advent theme engages us to look deeply into ourselves to explore what it is that we truly seek to obtain in this life as we prepare for the life to come. It is not necessarily our physical wants or needs that must be met but rather our heart's desire for oneness with the Lord.

Many if not all of us hinge our happiness and base our futures on the state of the economy rather than on the significance of hope. Perhaps this is an opportunity for us to reprioritize our values; readjust our holiday habits; renew our convictions of faith; and restore the spiritual gift of hope in this time of preparation.

As we consider the scripture readings, especially the words of St. Paul to the Corinthians, perhaps we may think that we do "have it all". We really are blessed with spiritual gifts, knowledge and discourse. However, what we may desire is the ongoing gift of Hope which is sweeter than any Wine of the month club or more satisfying that any sweet fruit of the month or any hot sauce. "Hope" and more specifically "Waiting in Hope" truly is the gift that keeps on giving.

THE SHARING TREE
