DEAR PARISHIONERS,

You and I can tell when a person or a community puts their hearts into what they do and who they are. We can just tell because that person exudes a real sense of personal conviction or that community displays a real sense of team spirit. That person or those people who give it all they got and commit themselves with undivided, generous hearts have a profound impact on us who see them. They lead us to a deeper faith in who they are and a deeper conviction in what they do. We, who see them, are drawn to them and desire to be like them.

In the gospel reading today we hear about the authority and power of Jesus teaching in the synagogue. The people are amazed at his abilities. The boy who was once a carpenter's son in Nazareth is now healing the sick, expelling demons, forgiving sins, teaching and preaching throughout all of Judea. Again, they were amazed by all of this, especially with the authority and power he used. Where does this come from? What is the origin of this conviction?

Jesus, above and beyond any human being, is the one who puts his pure, undivided and generous heart into everything that he does, into everything that he says, into everything that he is. His Sacred Heart and the Heart of the Father are one in the same. That is where his authority, power and conviction come from. In the same way, we are called to have pure, undivided and generous hearts.

Paul's letter to the Corinthians is often and easily taken out of context as some people think that Paul denounces marriage as he thinks of it as a distraction. Taken in context, Paul is addressing the Corinthian community asking them for an attitude of detachment from the dear, familiar things which tend to absorb the human person in for them to be prepared for the Lord's final coming - which, for Paul, was to come very soon.

Paul is asking them to remain committed to the status they already have as single, married or spiritual. Rather than denouncing marriage, Paul is asking them to have hearts that are pure, undivided and generous, directed toward the Lord as St. Paul says, in the last sentence of the second reading, "I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction."

The Psalm response for this weekend, "If today you hear his voice harden not your hearts," again calls us to have pure, undivided and generous hearts. Pure, undivided and generous hearts are hard to come by this day and age. When it comes to making commitments, too many are unwilling to give it all they got, to put all of their heart into it. This is made self evident as fewer and fewer people are getting married as they resort to living together. Fewer and fewer people live the chaste single life. And obviously, fewer and fewer people are coming forward to make a life long commitment to live a celibate religious vocation.

Sadly, we know of many people today that have divided and selfish hearts. They are distracted by the desire to have everything but yet commit to nothing. The trend of the culture is to focus on "self" with little or no concern for others. The motto of society seems to be, "I want it all!" with as much personal gain and as little personal commitment as possible. This attitude, besides being a contributing factor to the moral decay of our society, is destroying the institution of marriage, the dignity of the single status and the ongoing existence of the celibate religious life.

Finally, on the matter of generosity. Our ancestors had very generous hearts. Just think about all the blood, sweat and tears they poured out for us in building up our church communities, raising their families during difficult

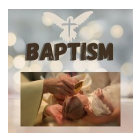
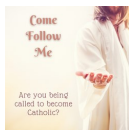


High School Confirmation Class

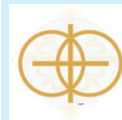

How many of your contemporaries today will make it to 50 plus years of marriage together? How many of the families today have a son or daughter who went off to the seminary or the convent? It is evident to us that they, in general, had hearts that were more pure, undivided and generous than we do today. Why should we be any less pure, undivided and generous?

Perhaps the reflection that we can take with us throughout the week is a reflection on matters of the heart. Do we have divided or undivided hearts? Are we remaining true to our commitments? Are we open to making commitments? Do we have a calling to live fully and love completely in one of the three vocations of committed marriage, chaste single life, or celibate religious life?
