

#### **DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

Please welcome Fr. Ron Hoye who will be covering the weekend Masses and leading the parish on retreat during the evenings of Sunday, February 18, Monday, February 19 and Tuesday, February 20. We are blessed to have him with us over the course of these initial days of Lent. The theme of his lively presentations is "Ignite Your Faith." Please make every effort to attend this parish retreat and engage in the process of igniting your faith.

On this first Sunday of Lent we embark upon a journey of forty days and forty nights – a timeframe of repentance and preparation – a timeframe that is noted in the scripture readings for us as we recall the story of Noah and the Ark and Jesus in the desert.

The first reading is the story of Noah who, with his family, was confined for forty days and nights in the bowels of the Ark while the rains fell upon the Earth to cleanse the world of sin. In the midst of the darkness of that ship, surrounded by the fowl smell of animals and tossed around by the torrents of the sea – Noah and all those living creatures remained hopeful for the promises of God – a new covenant. Those forty days and nights changed him and all of creation. They taught him as they taught all others to avoid sin, live in grace and be faithful to God above all else.

For Jesus, this was a period of preparations for his ministry. All alone, subjected to human trial and tempted by Satan, Jesus remained hopeful as he remained true to his calling. Those forty days and nights changed him as they prepared him to be of single minded and whole-hearted service to God.

In that first reading about Noah and the Ark we learn of the establishment of a new covenant marked by signs of God's peace in the rainbow and the dove. A promise is made by God to never again destroy all mortal beings. As the story of salvation history unfolds however we know that God keeps His covenant with us but we continue to break it. In the Gospel reading we learn of Jesus who is on his way to restore us and establish a new and eternal covenant by reconciling us with God.

It is that new and eternal covenant with God that the second reading from 1st Peter mentions when there is reference made again to Noah and then to the risen Christ. 1st Peter makes a connection to baptism and our continued journey of faith through this life. In a sense, the second reading suggests that we are still afloat through the waters of baptism in a vessel – an Ark – called the Church. 1st Peter (4:7) declares that the "the consummation of all is close at hand."

Therefore, we are placed in-between first paradise and our final destination. We have the assurance of God's continual care within the Church to which faith family we were united by Baptism; we remember the fearful warning that all this can end abruptly by our own death or by the final consummation of creation in the end - that should change us.

Yes, we are still afloat as was Noah on the Ark hoping for new life on a new world transformed by new cleansing waters. We are still afloat in the Ark of the Church with hope in eternal life through the waters of baptism. Let's join together in traversing these waters and ignite our faith in the One, Jesus, who has come to save us.



As we begin the penitential season of Lent, the feel of the Mass and the music will change. We will sing the Mass of Spirit an Grace setting for our Gospel Acclamation and Eucharistic responses. As in the past, we will echo the Kyrie Eleison (Lord have mercy) as part of our Penitential Rite at the beginning of Mass, and we will chant the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) before Communion. During these six weeks we "bury" the Glory to God and the Alleluia, and we "fast" from these joyful hymns during our time of repentance. They will be "resurrected" on Easter



when we celebrate with joy the new life which Jesus brings to us. During Lent, the music will be more somber and reflective, and we use more melodies which are in minor keys. We will not have a prelude hymn and

we will sing a song of praise at the end of Communion instead of at the dismissal, allowing the priest to recess out of the church in silence at the end of Mass. Our Lenten journey will feel more sparse and quiet, more time for reflection and individual prayer. We will be singing a new hymn which was used at our celebration of Confirmation in January. It's called **Christ in Me Arise by Trevor Thomson**. We will also sing a hymn called "There is A Longing" by Anne Quigley which is also somewhat new to our repertoire. 
