## **DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

Every year there is the state wrestling tournament that is held. The 2024 boy's tournament just concluded last week and the girl's tournament ended the first part of February. Competitive high school wrestlers from the four corners of the state contend for the title of their district and weight class.

From what I remember during my younger days, at the end of the tournament there was a ceremony when the medals were handed out for the three top finishers of each weight class and district. These young wrestlers approach a platform that was constructed to emphasize the three levels of the first, second and third place. The first stands in the center at the greatest height. The second is placed on the right of the first on a lower level. And finally, the third place is on the left of the first on the lowest level of the three. (Today, there are multiple levels with some going up to 8th place.)

It is quite obvious that the intention of the construction of this platform is to give due attention to the highest, middle section, first place state champion. And, no matter what weight class or district this wrestler is from, as they stand on that first-place platform, the look on their face is absolutely brilliant. I can't help but to think of what is going through their mind at that moment, in that very instant. I am positive that they are mindful of the sacrifice that has been made to get to where they are and I am sure that they are filled with glory as they might say to themselves, "How good is it for us to be here."

Somewhere, in the same auditorium, amongst the throng of people is someone else who has the same thoughts in the same instance. It is not one of his teammates. It is not the wrestling coach. It is not their friends. It is their father or mother or both who has the same brilliance in their face, remembering the same sacrifices made and sharing in the same glory of the moment as they may also say, "How good it is for us to be here."

#### Sacrifice and Glory together as one, bless the father and behold the son.

The scripture readings this weekend provide us with two Father/Son story settings that both contain a nuance of sacrifice and glory. In the first reading from the Book of Genesis, Abraham is with his only Son, Isaac and in the Gospel of Mark, God is with his only Son, Jesus. However, instead of mounting a platform at the State Wrestling tournament in Des Moines they climbed a sacred mountain in the Holy Land of Israel.

Abraham and Isaac climbed the mountain of Moriah and together they built an altar of sacrifice to God. Please appreciate the communion between the father, Abraham, and the son, Isaac. Imagine, if you will, the sweat of their brow as they together built this altar. Try to understand the innocents of the son, Isaac. Imagine the emotions of Abraham as he prepared to sacrifice his son, "his only one, whom he loved." Feel the glory of the announcement of the angel who not only has Abraham spare the life of his son but also bears abundant blessings to him and his descendants forever because of Abraham's devotion and obedience.

#### Sacrifice and Glory together as one, Bless the Father and Behold the Son.

Jesus and his disciples climbed the Mountain of Tabor. The disciples give witness to the glory of Jesus shown in brilliance as he stood together in the company of Moses and Elijah, one on his right and the other on his left. A voice from heaven says, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Soon enough, from among their own voices we hear, "It is good that we are here."

Please appreciate the communion between the Father and the Son. Imagine, if you will, the sweat, blood, tears and anguish they shed together as they walk to Jerusalem for the final time. Try to understand the innocence of the Son, Jesus. Feel the emotions of the Father as He prepares to sacrifice His Son, "His only Son, whom He loved."

#### Sacrifice and glory together and as one, Bless the Father and Behold the Son.

The Lenten season is a good time for us, as faithful believers, to really embrace the reality of sacrifice and to intentionally ponder upon the glory that awaits us in the end. We are called to prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We are invited to

In today's readings we hear the familiar Gospel of Jesus taking Peter, James and John up to a high mountain top to pray, and while they are there, his apostles witness Elijah and Moses talking to Jesus and then they hear the voice of God say, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Jesus' transfiguration is found in three of the Gospels, and it is proclaimed for the second Sunday of Lent every year, which tells us this is an important message for our Lenten journey. To transfigure means to change in appearance. Isn't that what we are called to do every year during Lent? To grow closer to our God through prayer, fasting and giving. Today we will sing the hymn "Transfigure Us O Lord," by Bob Hurd. Listen to the refrain: "Break the chains that bind us; speak your healing word, and where you lead we'll follow. Transfigure us O Lord." At our parish mission last weekend, we were called to change our hearts by serving others and through gratitude. God calls us to take the gifts he has given us and share them with others. And it doesn't matter how humble those gifts might be: writing, singing, caring for loved ones, or making someone laugh. This is a simple message, but one that we need to be reminded of. All we need to do is to let go of our fear and share our love with others.
