**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

Have you ever heard of the Svalbard Global Seed Vault, otherwise known as a doomsday vault or Noah's ark for plant life? This vault, dug into a mountain side – 400 feet tunneled through the permafrost, is located on a group of frozen islands 500 miles north of mainland Norway. Its purpose is to protect future food crops from nuclear wars, natural disasters or any other global crises. Officially opening on February 26, 2008.

Currently it has now secured more than 1.1 million seed varieties since it opened in 2008. That amount of seed sample represents an estimated three-quarter of the biological diversity of the world's major food crops. This giant ice box has a capacity of storing 4.5 million varieties of crops and securing 2.25 billion seeds. The harsh conditions outside keep them well protected and the natural arctic temperatures inside keeps them well preserved. This unmanned facility holds seeds that will still be viable 20,000 years from now.

These seeds, still viable and full of great potential, are suspended in a stasis – frozen in time – for up to 20,000 years. That is an incredible shelf-life. And, it truly gives credence to the scripture passage from John, "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat, but if it dies, it produces much fruit."

I was not aware of the existence of a "seed vault." I am fascinated by the science and I am happy to know that we, as a global community, are taking steps to ensure that future generations will benefit from our planning and participation here and now.

However, as we make the jump from genetic seeds of vegetation to spiritual seeds of faith there is quite a distinction. The seeds stored in the arctic permafrost can be thawed out and planted 20,000 years from now. We, with our seeds of faith, don't have that long of a shelf life. And, even though the global community is making efforts to secure food resources for future generations, this local parish community cannot tuck away, suspend in a stasis or freeze our seeds of faith. Our future generations, those of our youth who already belong to this parish and those yet to come, need us to plant our seeds now in order that they may enjoy the fruits that come from our faithfulness to God and our commitment to His church.

Sometimes I wonder if we treat our faith seeds like those frozen seeds north of Norway. Do we hold them back from their due time? Are they frozen in fear? Do we suspend them in selfishness when we are called, in humility and generosity, to plant them without hesitation; foster them with great care and share their fruits with those around us here and now? How do Jesus' words about the seed falling into the ground, dying, and only then producing fruit challenge you? What needs to die in you?

Please reflect on this story entitled, "**The Fern and the Bamboo**"

One day I decided to quit.... I quit my job, my relationship, my spirituality. I wanted to quit my life. I went to the woods to have one last talk with God. "God", I said. "Can you give me one good reason not to quit?"

His answer surprised me... "Look around," He said. "Do you see the fern and the bamboo?" "Yes," I replied. When I planted the fern and the bamboo seeds, I took very good care of them. I gave them light. I gave them water. The fern quickly grew from the earth. Its brilliant green covered the floor. Yet nothing came from the bamboo seed. But I did not quit on the bamboo.

In the second year the Fern grew more vibrant and plentiful. And again, nothing came from the bamboo seed. But I did not quit on the bamboo." *Continued on page 6.*

Today's gospel is a turning point in Jesus' ministry as he announces, "the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." He tells his apostles, "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." As we receive the body of Christ today, we sing the familiar hymn by Bernadette Farrell, "Unless A Grain of Wheat Shall Fall." The words of this hymn remind us what Lent is all about: dying to oneself, sacrificing for others, as Jesus did. Jesus was troubled as he recognized that he would have to suffer and die in order to fulfill God's plan. As Christians, we know that death is not the final word, and if we remain in God and God's word lives in us, then we also can bear much fruit. Lent is a time for us to grow through our sacrifices and through our prayer. Through dying to old ways, we discover new ways to live, better choices to help us live in God's love. The verse below speaks so simply of our calling as followers of Jesus: we need to hold firm through the ups and downs of life. Only 2 weeks until Easter! Its never too late to start or restart your Lenten journey. One tiny grain of wheat can grow into a huge stalk of many, many grains. Through prayer, fasting and giving, we can grow in our faith and share God's love with all those we encounter.

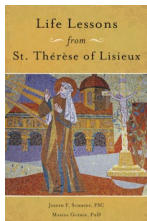


High School Confirmation Class

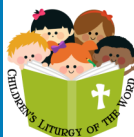

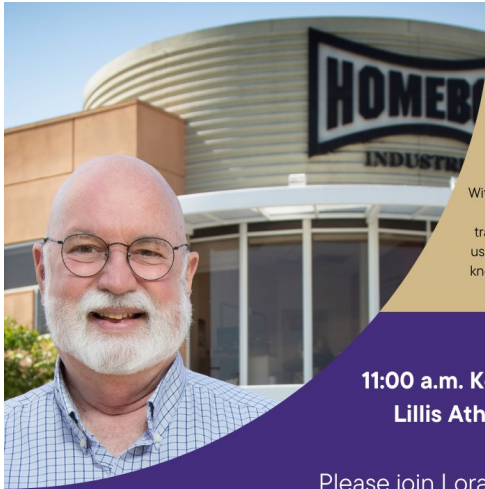

He said, "In the third year, there was still nothing from the bamboo seed. But I would not quit. In the fourth year, again, there was nothing from the bamboo seed. I would not quit."

He said, "Then in the fifth year a tiny sprout emerged from the earth. Compared to the fern it was seemingly small and insignificant. But just 6 months later the bamboo rose to over 100 feet tall. It had spent the five years growing roots. Those roots made it strong and gave it what it needed to survive. I would not give any of my creations a challenge it could not handle."

He said to me. "Did you know, my child, that all this time you have been struggling, you have actually been growing roots. I would not quit on the bamboo. I will never quit on you. Don't compare yourself to others." He said. "The bamboo had a different purpose than the Fern, yet, they both make the forest beautiful." "Your time will come," God said to me. You will rise high!" "How high should I rise?" I asked. "How high will the bamboo rise?" He asked in return. "As high as it can?" I questioned. "Yes." He said, "Give me glory by rising as high as you can." I left the forest and brought back this story. I hope these words can help you see that God will never give up on you.....
