DEAR PARISHIONERS,

The months of May and June are times of recognition for our parents. Mother's day and Father's day are designated times that we honor our Mom's and Dad's for all that they have done for us. Some of the parents we honor have really given their all for us. For some, the next thing to God is a parent who is giving, forgiving and loving.

These parents give their whole selves for their families. It is a selfless love that motivates them to do what they do and to be who they are. The love that dwells within them can then somehow call them to outward action as they become involved in activities outside the home in the midst of their community; in their church; the school; and their town. For them, home is where the heart is but their understanding of home goes beyond the house in which they live. They show a selfless love to help make this world a better place in which to live. The example of these parents gives us a great lesson of how we all could and should live our lives. In a selfless manner these people live and die by the motto, "To be all things for all people."

Unfortunately, this motto is often construed as being unhealthy because of the undue stress it puts on an individual. They are always giving and never receiving. This leads to discouragement, frustration, disgust, and resentment. In extreme cases, this may lead up to physical burnout or an emotional or mental breakdown. Their motives may come from the faith that they embody, the hope that they hold in their hearts, and the love and charity that they are called to share, but this can all come to a human limitation.

The reality of this matter is that many people do not know what complete selfless love is all about. Therefore, the people who do live unselfishly and give of themselves freely are often times taken for granted or taken advantage of by their community; their workplace; their school; their church; and even their own families. So, thank goodness we have special days that give recognition to those wonderful people who show us that selfless love. It is good and healthy that we take note of their accomplishments; thank them for their efforts; celebrate their generosity; and continue to encourage them not to give up on us.

Today is a special day in which we give recognition to our loving God. It is the solemnity of Trinity Sunday. We celebrate this day in honor of a God who, since the beginning of time, immerses God's whole self as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, into the project of humanity that God has so wonderfully created. We celebrate an incredible God who has done and is doing some remarkable things. The triune God has shown us a selfless desire through a selfless love, to make this world a better place in which to live. God is One who is giving, forgiving and loving constantly inviting and drawing us to Himself.

This unified Godhead gives his all. The Trinity gives us a great idea of our God who is truly the only One who is, "All things for all people." The Trinity embodies this selfless love that inspires God's actions and signifies who God really is for us.

The doctrine of the Trinity is beyond the confines of our minds. Therefore, it is often not completely understood nor is it fully comprehended or appreciated. However, I believe, it does resonant in our hearts if we allow it if we practice selfless love. Unfortunately, again, the reality of this matter lies in the fact that many people do not really know what true selfless love is all about. How often have we taken for granted or taken advantage of our God and the goodness that God has shared with us? God is always giving to us unconditionally and generously. How often does God receive our thanks and praise unconditionally and generously?

The central message of the solemnity of this day is the fact that God's selfless love does not divide into Father, Son and Holy Spirit but it multiplies in and through these dimensions (persons) of the Blessed Trinity. God will always be with those who
