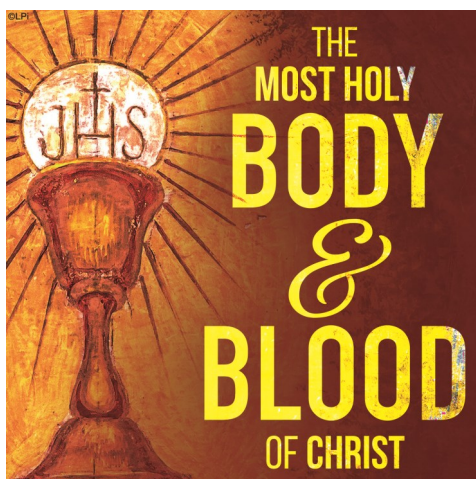

**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

A doctor gets upset about obesity in America and the rising tide of diabetes so he tells a group of patients, "The stuff we put into our stomachs is terrible. Red meat is awful. Soft drinks corrode your stomach lining. Chinese food is loaded with MSG. High-fat diets can be disastrous, and none of us realizes the long-term harm caused by the germs in our drinking water. But there is one thing that is the most dangerous of all. Can anyone here tell me what food it is that causes the most grief and suffering for years and years after eating it?" They all sit there with blank stares until an old man finally raises his hand. The doctor calls on him, "Yes, sir - can you tell all of us what food it is that causes the most grief and suffering for years and years after eating it?" The old fella answers and says in a grumpy voice, "A piece of your own wedding cake."

Dr. John Allen is a neuro-anthropologist working at the Dornsife Cognitive Neuroscience Imaging Center and Brain and Creativity Institute, University of Southern California. Since 1998, he has conducted human neuro-anatomical research as a member of the cognitive science research group, first at the University of Iowa and more recently at USC. His most recent book is entitled *The Omnivorous Mind: Our Evolving Relationship with Food*. (2012)

Dr. Allen says this about Food and Memory, "We all have our food memories, some good and some bad. The taste, smell, and texture of food can be extraordinarily evocative, bringing back memories not just of eating food itself but also of place and setting. Food is an effective trigger of deeper memories of feelings and emotions, internal states of the mind and body...first evolution has seen to it that food in general may be a privileged target of memory in the brain. There is a part of the brain called the hippocampus that is critical for memory. The hippocampus has strong connections with parts of the brain that are important for emotion and for smell. Emotion and smell no doubt contribute to the power of some food memories, but the hippocampus has more direct links to the digestive system. Many of the hormones that regulate appetite, digestion, and eating behavior also have receptors in the hippocampus. Finding food is so important to survival that it is clear that the hippocampus is primed to form memories about and around food."

As we celebrate this solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ we do honor the faith declaration that we proclaim as Catholics - that the Eucharist is the Real and Persistent Presence of Jesus Christ, body, blood, soul and divinity. We also, as the scriptures suggest, celebrate this feast day of Corpus Christi and, indeed, every Catholic Mass as a Food Memory.

In the gospel we recall the great miracle when Jesus multiplied the loaves and fish in order to feed the multitude who sat down before him. What an incredible experience that is associated with food. Don't you think that every time thereafter, when one of those five thousand sat down for a meal of bread and fish - they would remember being present at that event with Jesus and his Apostles? Food triggers a very fond memory.

In the second reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians we read of how Paul passed along the teaching of the Last Supper when Jesus broke bread with his disciples for the last time. How he, in the form of bread and wine, gave of his body and blood and said, "Do this in remembrance of me". This is an establishment of a Food Memory that we are to experience and offer on a frequent basis as it continuously unites us to Him. We do this, partake of his body and blood, not only for our own spiritual nourishment but also out of honor for him who was, who is and who is to come. The last sentence of the second reading is, "For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes."
