Are you a big fan of music from the 60's and early 70's?

"You're So Vain" are the main words from a song written and performed by the American female singer-songwriter Carly Simon released as a single in 1972. The lyrics describe a self-absorbed lover who is difficult to have a relation with because of this affliction of narcissism.

"Money" is the main word of a song by the English rock band Pink Floyd in 1973 written by Roger Watters. Watters wrote the lyrics to express irony and to critique the power of money and the capitalist system in general.

"Money, Money" are the main words in a song by the Swedish pop group ABBA released in 1976. It expresses the longing for a life of comfort and ease, attainable through wealth, rather than the struggles of hard work. The song's narrator, a woman, works tirelessly but barely makes ends meet. She dreams of a wealthy man or the possibility of striking it rich through gambling, highlighting a desire to escape financial hardship.

All these main words and lyrics in the songs mentioned above remind us of some of our own inclinations of being self-absorbed in vanity and overly preoccupied with accumulating wealth in greed while striving to holding on to it as if it were our god. There are, indeed, inherent dangers that accompany these inclinations.

The first reading from the Book of Ecclesiastes addresses the dangers of vanity. Whereas the gospel reading from Luke addresses the dangers of greed, money or material possessions. These two vices within these two readings seem to be a figurative song warning us against these trappings that have been with us from the ages.

However, "SARX" is the main word in tune from the early 60's and I'm not talking about the 1960's but THE 60's as in A.D., after the death of Jesus. When Paul addresses the Corinthian community in the second reading for this weekend he intends to address not just vanity and greed but all of the sinful human inclinations: "immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry" (a.k.a. SARX) that keep us from "putting on the new self" being united with Christ and one another in this world.

In Greek, the word $\sigma \acute{a} \rho \xi$ (pronounced SARX) translates to flesh, body, or human nature. It can refer to the physical substance of a living being, the human body, or even human nature with its inherent weaknesses and passions including its frailties, mortality, and susceptibility to sin.

Paul not only warns the Colossians (3:5-10) but also the other early Christian communities as well as he addresses SARX to the Romans (1:26-27; 13:11-14); the people in Corinth (1 Corinthians 5:1-11; 6:12-20); the Galatians (5:19-21); the Ephesians (5:1 -5); and to the Thessalonians (4:3-8).

Paul urges us to, "seek what is above and not what is on earth." If we do this we gain a perspective that is of God. This perspective lifts up our hearts and minds to be similar to the heart and mind of Jesus who is for us, true God and true Man.

In the gospel of Luke, Jesus urges us to become rich in what matters to God by doing away with things that tie us to earth. It is a daring way to live out our call to discipleship. To battle against capital sins and carnal desires (SARX), I close with this inspirational thought from a story I found entitled, "I Dare You."




