**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

It was a few years ago, when I lived on the Loras Campus as Vocation Director, that I recall seeing the banners in the main chapel that read, "Don't Just Go To Church, Be The Church." As the liturgical celebration this weekend focuses our attention on the Feast of St. John Lateran (The Pope's Church) and as we continue our archdiocesan pastoral planning process (Journey In Faith) I thought it worthy to reflect on those words displayed on those banners. "Don't Just Go To Church, Be The Church."

"Be the Church" speaks to Christian Service as something that we are all called to participate in on a daily basis. It is an integral part of our Baptism and our Universal Call to Holiness. However, and unfortunately, I don't think that we (a majority of Catholics) have a good grasp on the significance of Christian service as quintessential to our identity as Catholics. Christian service, it seems, is something that is optional, additional or extra but never essential. In the minds of many just putting your hour in on Sunday, if we even accomplish that, is all that is necessary. This is just not true.

Christian service should be understood as an outward expression of the Christian faith that dwells within. Without service our faith is incomplete and some say that it is even dead. In the New Testament, St. James (2:14-17) tells us through his letter about this matter. James says, "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says they have faith but does not have works? Can that faith save them? If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, keep warm and eat well,' but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also, faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead."

St. James says to those in his day and to us today that our faith must show itself in actions, our love show itself in deeds, and our hope always give us courage. If not, we are empty and what good is that?

Hearing this from St. James causes us to step back and look at life and faith again. There are a ton of people out there who call themselves Christians/Catholics but they have not offered a finger to lift a burden; a helping hand to lighten a load; or a tender heart to console another.

The lingo of the elections may be still fresh in our minds. Do you know what the word "certification" means? In terms of the election, it means that the votes that have been collected are publicly declared as authentic, accurate and true by a formal statement. In a like manner, service is a form of certification regarding our faith. Service is a public declaration or a formal statement of a faith that is authentic, accurate and true.

When we participate in service it is so important that we recognize it not so much for what we do but realize it as a part of who we are. We have to get beyond thinking of service as some perfunctory activity - as some humdrum action. Rather, service should be thought of as a profound expression of our very being, an authentic sign of our love for God, as some special gift from our heart.

The gospel of Matthew (25:31-46) informs us that Jesus will come back to judge the living and the dead. When he does he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and goats on his left. It is those on his right who are welcomed into heaven because they were the ones who offered service to those in need. Jesus says to them, "Amen I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did it for me." Those on his left were condemned for they did nothing, they did not offer service to one of these least ones - they did not do anything for Christ.

We have to make a conscious decision to live a life of service and to be a person of service. This is where I would like to share of an Old Testament character who had to make that fundamental decision not only for himself but for his family and for his whole tribe. His name was Joshua.

Joshua is the one who succeeded Moses. Moses stood on Mount Nebo to look at the promised land but never crossed over into it. He died there. It was Joshua then that lead the people across the Jordan river to the promised land thus demonstrating God's fidelity in giving to the Israelites the land God had promised.

Joshua gives witness and testifies to the fundamental decision that he and his household will serve God alone and above all other things. First Joshua tells the people what the Lord had said to him, "I gave you a land which you had not tilled and cities which you

Please join us for Morning Prayer on Tuesdays beginning at 7am and Evening Prayer on Tuesdays beginning at 4:30 pm.



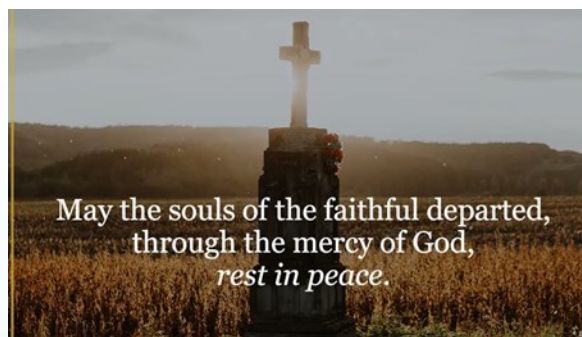

had not built, to dwell in; you have eaten of vineyards and olive groves which you did not plant." Then Joshua said, "Now, therefore, fear (reverence) the Lord and serve him completely and sincerely. Cast out the gods your fathers served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the Lord. If it does not please you to serve the Lord, decide today whom you will serve, the gods your fathers served beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose country you are dwelling. As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."

Let the words of St. James, the gospel lesson of St. Matthew and the actions of Old Testament Joshua influence your minds and hearts.

"Don't Just Go to Church, Be The Church."
